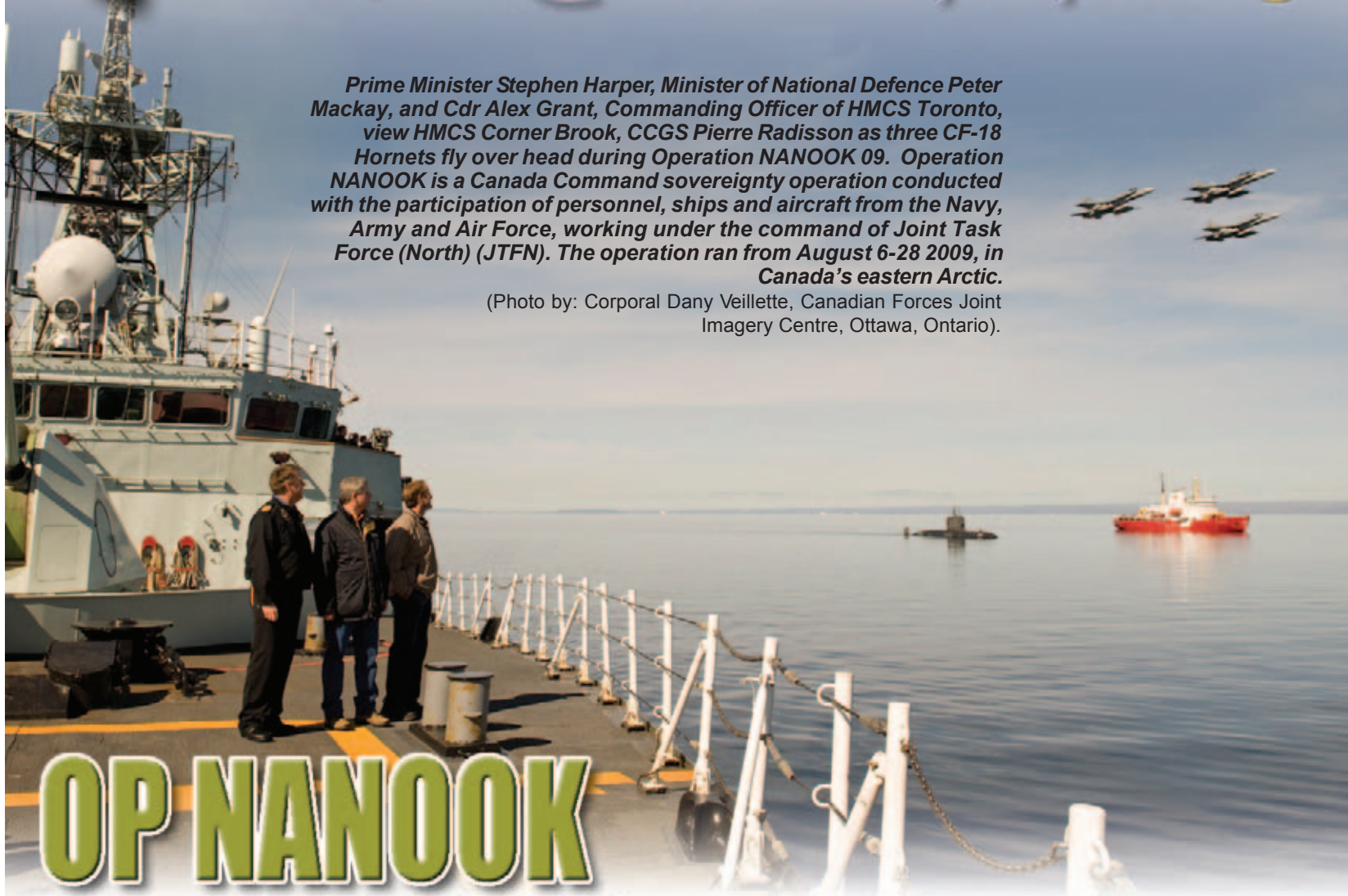

OP NANOOK

Canada Details Premier Annual Northern Sovereignty Operation

NR 09.05 - August 7, 2009

YELLOWKNIFE, N.T. - From August 6 to 28, 2009, the Government of Canada will conduct a sovereignty operation, the Canadian Forces' Operation NANOOK 09, in the eastern Arctic. This operation will see the CF demonstrate a visible presence with land, sea and air forces operating in the Baffin Island region. It will include sovereignty patrols, a military exercise, and a whole-of-government exercise designed to demonstrate Canada's ability to operate in the North.

"The presence in our North of the Canadian Forces and other departments shows our Government's commitment to protecting and demon-

strating control over the air, land and sea within our jurisdiction, and responding to emergencies in support of the territorial government," said the Honourable Peter MacKay, Minister of National Defence and Minister for the Atlantic Gateway.

This year's operation will include an anti-submarine warfare exercise with Her Majesty's Canadian Ships (HMCS) Toronto and Glace Bay, and HMCS Corner Brook, one of Canada's four Victoria-class submarines. Land forces, comprised of Canadian Rangers and the Arctic Reserve Company Group from Ontario, will also deploy forward with the Navy and in Canadian Coast Guard Ship Pierre Radisson. The Air Force will be flying

the CP-140 Aurora, CH-124 Sea King, CC-138 Twin Otter, CF-18 Hornet, CC-130 Hercules aircraft, while Transport Canada will be flying the Dash-7 throughout the exercise. Following the military exercise, government agencies will turn their attention to supporting Nunavut's Emergency Management Organization in their own exercise to test emergency preparedness in response to a critical infrastructure failure.

"Operation NANOOK 09 presents an ideal opportunity to validate and improve upon our collective capabilities to operate effectively in our North," said General Walt Natynczyk, Chief of the Defence Staff.

OP PARASOL – 10 Years Later

On May 21st, 1999 Nijazi Muji stepped out of a plane and onto Canadian soil and,

with his wife and infant daughter, finally discovered the peace and security that was sorely lacking in the Balkans.

It was during this extended period of intense conflict that “ethnic cleansing” drove millions from the disputed Serbian province of Kosovo into neighbouring Macedonia to the south. Canada played an important role in easing the burden of those escaping the conflict; close to half of the 5,000 ethnic-Albanian refugees accepted during this strife landed at CFB Greenwood (with the other half landing at CFB Borden,) before being housed temporarily by Canadian Forces bases across Ontario and the Maritimes.

Now, ten years after the success of Op PARASOL, Nijazi wanted to return to Greenwood from his home in Halifax to say “thank you.” With his wife and now four young children beside him, Nijazi spoke in front of the current 14 Wing Commander, Colonel Bill Seymour, the Wing Commander during Op PARASOL, Colonel (ret’d) Brian Handley, and an audience of about 35, comprised mostly of military personnel who were stationed at Greenwood at the time of the crisis

and several civilians who had volunteered.

“This is our home now,” said Nijazi about Canada, while acknowledging that Kosovo was also still very near and dear to his heart. “I’m very lucky to have two homes.” After speaking for about 10 minutes to the assembled crowd, he produced a stone map of Kosovo, made of minerals unearthed from the Trepca Mines of his homeland. “Just like my words are deep from my heart, this is deep from Kosovo.”

Col Seymour accepted the gift on behalf of the Wing and talked about the work done by 14 Wing Greenwood personnel and the Canadian

Forces overseas. “We know that our work, internationally, is appreciated,” he said, before inviting Col Handley to speak.

The former Wing Commander recalled the events that unfolded a decade ago and reminded everyone involved how successful the operation was, and how much work was involved to make it run smoothly. “Ten years goes by very quickly... Those of you here can remember it very well.”

The small ceremony ended with a group photo of all those who assisted in the refugee relief efforts being photographed with the Muji family, but not before the family was

presented with a watercolour print of various scenes from Op PARASOL. The original, painted by Anita Alpay to remember the events in question, hangs in the Greenwood Military Aviation Museum and is based on photographs from the time period.

Looking back, it’s clear that Canada and the Canadian Forces, including 14 Wing Greenwood personnel and local volunteers, made an enormous impact on the lives of people who lost much to the ethnic violence plaguing the region. Two thirds of the approximately 5,000 asylum-seekers now call Canada their home, and Nijazi Muji is proud to be one of them.

They have settled in Halifax, Nova Scotia and had three more children, Vesa(8), Deilli(5) and Mali(2).

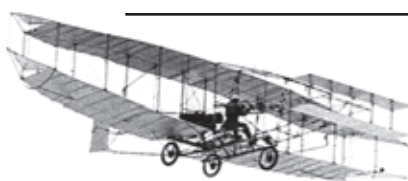

Emergency Childcare – Do you have a Childcare Plan?

The GMFRC offers Emergency Childcare Services that will assist families during an emergency childcare situation. Our goal is to provide CF families with the tools & resources you need to prepare for the challenges & emergencies this unique

lifestyle may bring. In order to support the CF member's ability to be available for operational duty, the family's needs must be acknowledged & identified so we can prepare ourselves for emergency situations. For those CF families with children, Emergency Childcare Services will offer you the resources you need for emergency preparedness.

This childcare plan is NOT the same as the "family care plan" form you are required to have on file with your unit. Our Childcare Plan requires more information- is used as a tool in preparing for the family's emergency childcare arrangements- and is kept on file with the GMFRC. We maintain a list of screened, qualified emergency childcare providers who will provide childcare to our military families in the event that your childcare arrangements are not working. Specifically, we will provide care for the following situations:

- When the CF member is employed/deployed away from home and the spouse/caregiver is unavailable due to illness or any other family emergency
- When the CF member is required to report for duty on short notice and the spouse/usual caregiver is unavailable
- When a single parent or both parents are CF members and they are unable to access the regular childcare provider in a deployment or emergency situation
- When there is illness of a child that would prevent a parent from accessing regular childcare arrangements for care at a time when the CF member's presence at work is critical to the military operation
- When there is a need for respite childcare due to the total family situation- including the CF member's work commitments
- When there are other circumstances not covered above and childcare is believed to be the solution to the problem (in these cases, approval must be given by the GMFRC Child Youth & Parenting Services Coordinator in consultation with DMFS)

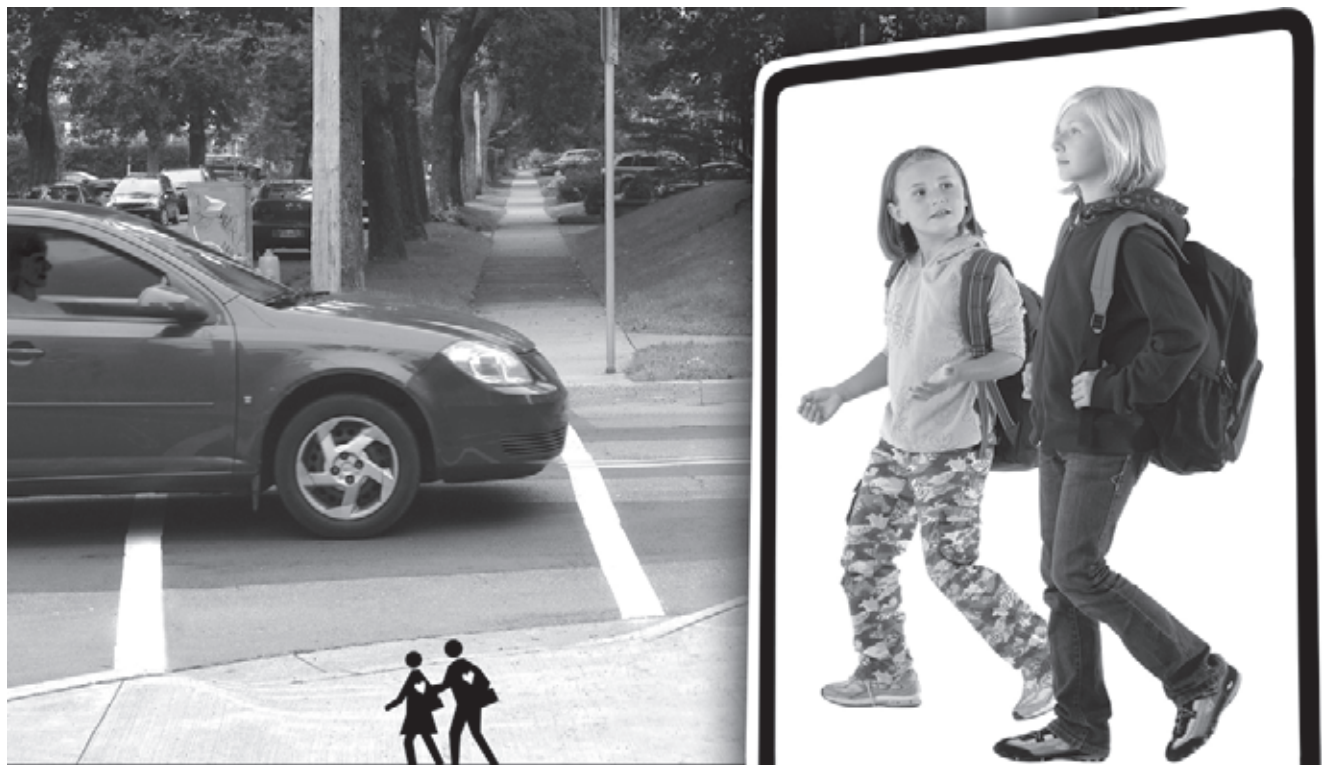



Historic Aircraft that Played a Significant Role in Canadian Aviation Heritage

Beech T-34 Mentor

The Beech T-34 was the last attempt by a small Canadian manufacturer to maintain itself in the aviation industry. Canadian Car and Foundry (CC&F) of Thunder Bay was one of the smaller manufacturers in Canada after the war – its efforts to remain in the industry highlight the problem of the period – a small Canadian market and too many manufacturers.

CC&F had designed its own aircraft in the 1930s and built Hurricanes and Helldivers under license during the Second World War. After the war it built Harvards under license; however, this contract was soon completed. Seeking new licenses CC&F acquired a contract to build 34 Mentors for the United States Air Force

(USAF). A further contract for 66 followed. In the United States Beech built 773 Mentors for the Air Force and Navy, a type chosen in part because of its gentle handling characteristics.

The Royal Canadian Air Force (RCAF) purchased 25 Mentors as the service required additional aircraft in order to meet the needs of the NATO Air Training Plan. The aircraft were used in a trial at No. 4 Flying Training School at Penhold, Alberta that went from 19 July 1954 to 10 February 1955. The Mentor was not selected as it was considered too easy to fly. During the course of the trial,

one aircraft was destroyed. The remaining aircraft were donated to Greece (one) and Turkey (23) under NATO's Mutual Aid Program.

The Beech Mentor is symbolic of Canada's aviation industry in the 1950s. With a small domestic market and too many manufacturers, CC&F could not remain in the industry. The small overall size of CC&F's Mentor production for both the RCAF and the USAF highlights the nature of the industry and how even a good training aircraft can be incapable of keeping a company solvent.

Le Beech T34 est la dernière tentative d'un constructeur canadien pour se maintenir dans l'industrie aéronautique. Canadian Car and Foundry (CC&F), de Thunder Bay, est l'un des plus petits constructeurs au Canada après la guerre. Les efforts qu'il déploie pour demeurer dans l'industrie mettent en relief le problème de cette période : un marché canadien restreint pour un trop grand nombre de constructeurs.

La CC&F a conçu son propre avion dans les années 30 et elle construit des Hurricane et des Helldiver sous licence pendant la Seconde Guerre mondiale. Après la guerre, cette société construit des Harvard sous licence, mais ce contrat est vite terminé. À la recherche de nouvelles licences, la CC&F obtient un contrat pour construire 34 Mentor destinés

à la force aérienne des États-Unis (USAF). Un autre contrat pour 66 appareils suit. Aux États-Unis, Beech construit 773 Mentor pour la USAF et la US Navy, un type choisi en partie en raison de ses caractéristiques facilitant le pilotage.

L'Aviation royale du Canada (ARC) achète 25 Mentor, puisqu'elle a besoin d'autres avions pour répondre aux besoins du Programme d'entraînement aérien de l'OTAN. Les avions servent à des essais à l'école d'entraînement au pilotage n° 4, à Penhold (Alberta), lesquels s'échelonnent du 19 juillet 1954 au 10 février 1955. Le Mentor n'est pas choisi,

car on considère qu'il est trop facile à piloter. Au cours des essais, l'un des avions est détruit. Les autres avions sont donnés à la Grèce (1) et à la Turquie (23) dans le cadre de l'accord d'assistance mutuelle de l'OTAN.

Le Beech Mentor symbolise l'industrie aéronautique au Canada dans les années 50. Du fait d'un marché intérieur restreint et de la présence d'un trop grand nombre de constructeurs, la CC&F n'a pu se maintenir dans l'industrie. La production globale réduite du Mentor de la CC&F tant pour l'ARC que pour la USAF met en lumière la nature de l'industrie et montre que même un bon avion d'entraînement ne peut permettre à une entreprise de demeurer solvable.

The Early Childhood Education Program at the Greenwood Military Family Resource Centre (GMFRC) is a site-specific program, licensed by the Nova Scotia's Department of Community Services. It has been serving this community since 2002.

The program is designed to meet the social, emotional, cognitive, fine and gross motor needs of children. The program strives to meet the unique individual needs of all children.

The curriculum provides developmentally age appropriate activities that foster growth in all areas. Early literacy and school readiness skills are incorporated into the program. Children are encouraged to participate and explore their environment through art, music, cognitive activities, circle time, gross motor, and dramatic play. Children are encouraged to participate in the selections of topics for the in-depth studies. This provides concrete learning opportunities for the children.

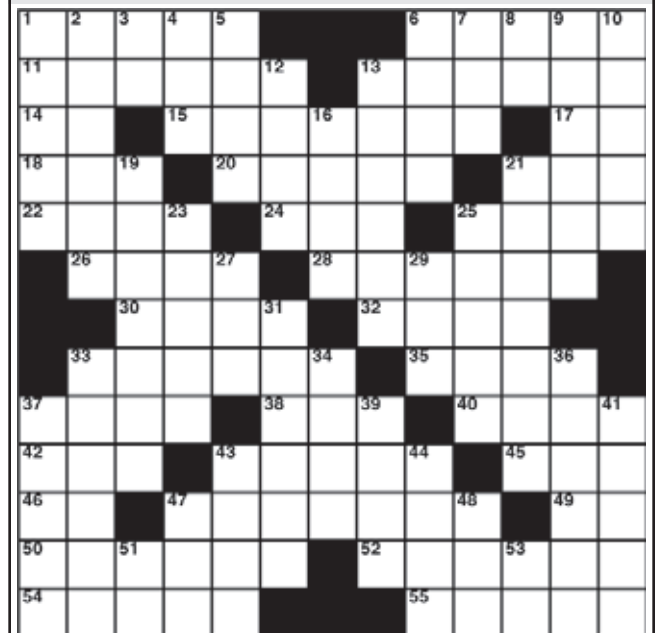
