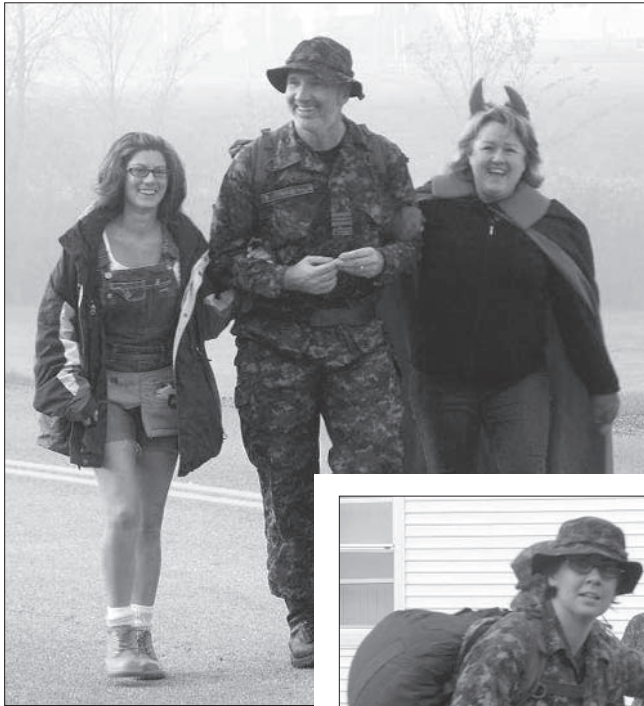

## Annapolis Valley Traffic Services Focus on Move Over Legislation

On November 12th the RCMP's Annapolis Valley traffic Services conducted a radar project on Hwy 101 in Avonport. A total of ten officers worked this project targeting both speeding as well as the new legislation for reduced speed for emergency vehicles.

Some motorists are still not aware of this legislation which came into law in May of 2010.

The new law says that when passing an emergency vehicle stopped on the shoulder or road with its lights flashing you

must slow down to 60 kilometers per hour, or keep to the posted speed limit, if it is less than 60 km/hour; and move over into the lane furthest away from the emergency vehicle, if the lane beside you is traveling in the same direction and you can do so safely. You must still slow down to 60 km/hour or keep to the posted speed limit if there is no other lane moving in the same direction as you. However, you are not required to move into an oncoming traffic lane.

You are not required to slow down or move over if the road

is divided by a median and the emergency vehicle is on the other side of the median.

An emergency vehicle is not just an ambulance. It also includes a police vehicle, firefighting vehicle, conservation officers' vehicle, and motor vehicle or motor carrier inspectors' vehicle. This law was created to enhance the safety of all emergency services personnel.

Current fines for a first offence under this law are between \$340.21 and \$685.21 depending on the speed you are traveling.

During the afternoon of November 12th the RCMP issued 23 summary offence tickets for speeding and stopped another 22 vehicles for speeding past emergency vehicles with their lights flashing.

# Theft from Vehicles in the Residential Housing Area 14 Wing Military Police Detachment

During the early morning hours of 12 November 2010, there was a rash of thefts from vehicles parked within the Residential Housing Area's of the Wing. The 14 Wing Military Police Detachment is actively investigating these thefts and pursuing every possible lead. To avoid becoming a victim yourself and to help prevent further theft from the vehicles in our community there are several things that we can all do to protect ourselves and to prevent and deter this type of activity from continuing.

The first and most important thing you can do is "Lock Your Vehicle" and roll up your windows, even if it is in your driveway or if you think you will be back in a few minutes. Opportunistic thieves will often rummage through any type of vehicle they find unlocked during the day or the night. As an added measure consider installing a vehicle alarm system.

Second, "Keep Attractive Items Out of Sight". Your vehicle may be targeted by thieves because you have left

attractive items out in plain view and even if it is locked they may not hesitate to break in if they see something they want. These items could include: Christmas presents, shopping bags, purses, cell phones or GPS devices, iPods, laptops and countless other attractive items. Leaving the GPS bracket in your window even though you take the GPS itself out, still indicates to a thief that you have that item. When you must store valuables in your vehicle for a short period of time, lock them in the trunk or, if your vehicle does not have a trunk, hide them under seats or in the locked glove box. Try not to cover items with coats or blankets as this may make thieves even more curious.

Thirdly, "Park in Well Lit Areas" and if possible leave your residential exterior lights on or even better install motion activated lights. A well lit area will aid in deterring thieves, and good lighting can give you or others the chance to provide an accurate description of what thieves are wearing and what they look like which will greatly assist this detachment in locating them. At this time of year try avoid underground

parkades and remote parking lots at malls and other shopping centres unless there is security, as these can become like a buffet for opportunistic hungry thieves attempting to steal your recently purchased Christmas presents.

All 14 Wing personnel and residents are encouraged to contact the Military Police Detachment dispatch at (902) 765-5111 or 911 immediately to pass on information concerning; vandalism, trespassing, suspicious activities or any other type of suspected or actual crime happening within the 14 Wing Greenwood area. Please do your part to protect your community and "If You See Something Say Something".

Also please be aware that The Military Police have established a means of reporting tips anonymously. This telephone service is available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. Callers are not required to leave their personal information. This is a 100% Anonymous system, there is no call display and no personnel answering, it is merely a voicemail. Please do your part and stand up against crime. This service is provided at (902) 765 (COPS) 2677.

## RCMP Annapolis Valley Traffic Services Enforce Seatbelt and Cell Phone Use

On November 14th the RCMP's Annapolis Valley traffic Services conducted enforcement projects in Coldbrook and North Kentville.

These projects focused on seatbelt compliance as well as the use of cell phones and other hand held devices.

In Coldbrook a total of

18 summary offence tickets were issued for seatbelt and cell phone use as well as another person being charged for having their windows

unlawfully tinted.

In North Kentville another 15 summary offence tickets were issued.

motorists that using a handheld device while driving is both distracting and dangerous. Fines start at \$167.71.

Please note that if you get a flu shot, you must wait 2 days after the shot before donating blood.

#### Did you know?.....

- One in eight Canadians have a disability - a total of 3.6 million people
- Around 10 per cent of the world's population live with disabilities
- Disabilities can affect us at any point in our lives. Some people are born with disabilities, while others experience them later in life because of accidents, illness or disease
- Women are more likely than men to have a disability, regardless of age
- Most disabilities affect individuals in one of the two following ways:
  - Mobility/agility limitations - this affects how people move around. People with mobility/agility disabilities may require wheelchairs or have some motor skills impairment.
  - Information processing - many disabilities affect the way people receive or process information. People with visual, hearing and learning disabilities require information in alternate formats.
- Persons with disabilities and those who support their efforts to work in mainstream environments will tell you that the largest single barrier they experience is not the disability itself but attitudinal barriers and misperceptions about their skills and ability to add value in the workplace setting
- Transportation still presents challenges for many persons with disabilities
- There are some disabilities that may not be apparent, but their impact is real - some examples: chemical sensitivities, fibromyalgia, chronic

fatigue, learning disabilities, mental health issues and eye disorders. **Allocation Policy Change - Priority 3 Applicants**

Effective immediately CFHA will be permitting individuals identified as Priority 3 applicants (RCMP, Indeterminate Government of Canada employees, full-time CFPSA employees, indeterminate employees of other Departments and DND contractors over 6 months) the opportunity to make an application to live in Residential Housing Units (RHUs).

The mandate of the Canadian Forces Housing Agency (CFHA) is to meet the residential accommodation needs of Canadian Forces members. If the Greenwood Housing Service Centre determines that fulfilling our mandate of providing residential housing to military personnel is in jeopardy, a moratorium will be reinstated without notice.

Applications are to be submitted to the Allocations Customer Service

Representative, Donna Giesbrecht. All applications will be assessed with RHUs being allocated by priority to those in need first.

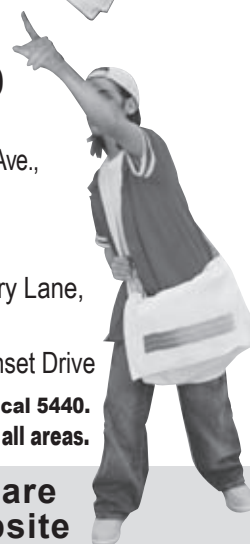

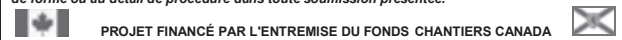

But during the night, there is you.

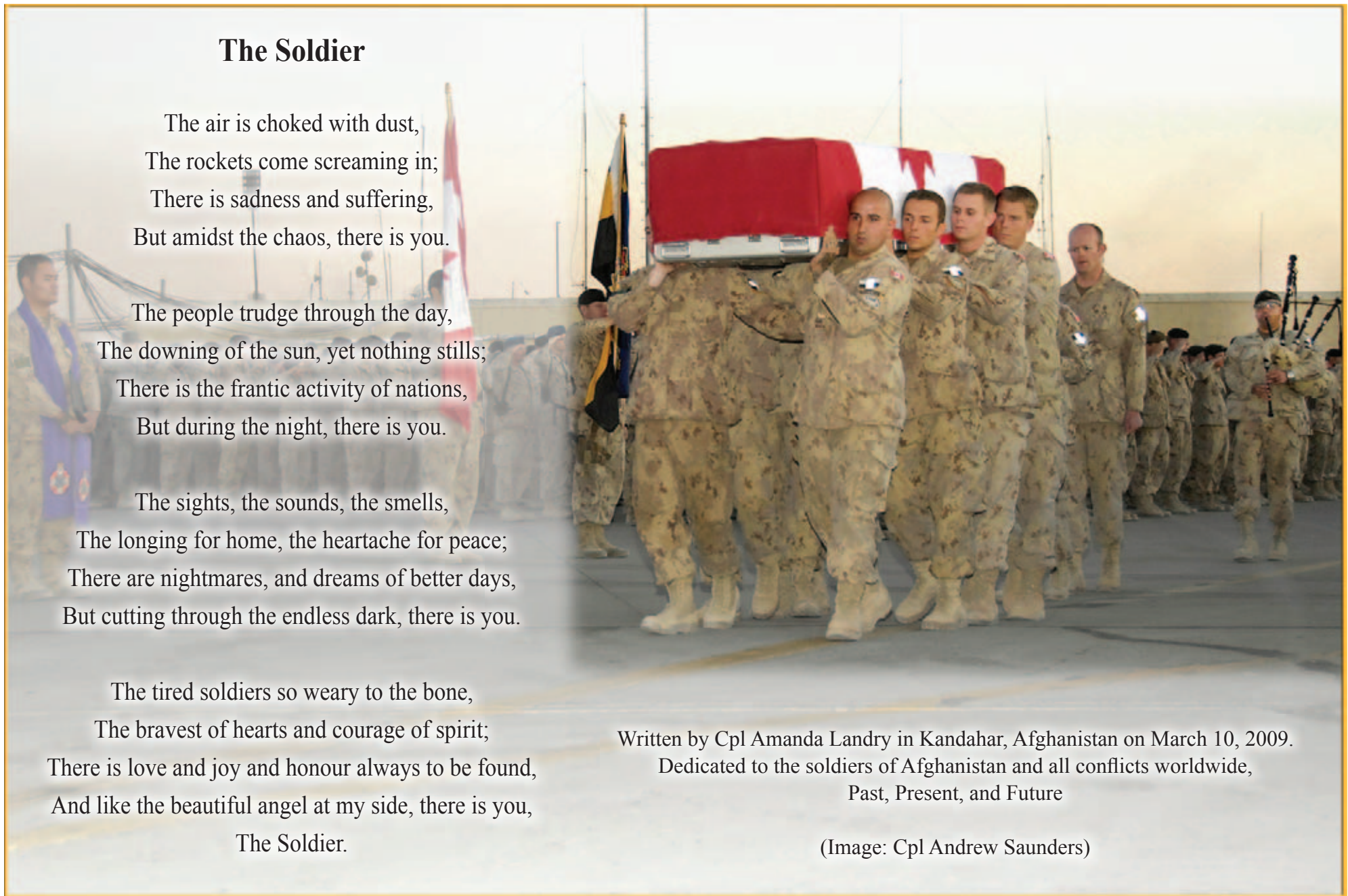
The sights, the sounds, the smells,

# GMFRC Full Day Casual Childcare Centre Coming Soon

As many of you are aware, our Casual Childcare Program has recently undergone a transformation from a licensed part day program, to a licensed Full Day Casual Childcare Centre. The Childcare Centre will have a licensed capacity of 25 spaces for children aged 3 months to 12 years. There is an infant program for children aged 3 to 17 months and a multi-aged program for children 18 months to 12 years of age. These programs are divided in order to provide developmentally age appropriate programming.

The aim of our Full Day Casual Childcare Service is to provide casual, affordable, flexible, and inclusive quality care to military families; to provide a service to parents so they may run errands, attend appointments, participate in community activities, or enjoy some free time; accommodate the GMFRC's Emergency Childcare Service and to support volunteers of the GMFRC. The centre provides a safe and happy atmosphere for children to learn and play.

The Childcare Centre will be open Monday to Friday, from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. We provide daily nutritious snacks and a hot lunch. Our

menu has been created in consultation with a Public Health Nutritionist.

Parents are encouraged to pre-book spaces a minimum of 24 hours in advance. We will accept bookings one month at a time, but **please remember that this service is casual and should not replace your full-time childcare arrangements.** This is a very popular service and is booked on a first come, first served basis.

**Program Fees:**

- Infant Program: Full Day \$30.00
- Infant Program: Half Day \$15.00
- Multi Aged Program: Full Day \$24.00
- Multi-Age Program: Half Day \$12.00
- Full Day: more than any 4 consecutive hours
- Half Day: up to any 4 consecutive hours
- Additional siblings are 1/2 the cost of the daily rate.

With all these wonderful changes, the new Casual Childcare Centre has increased its staff to include a Childcare Programs Director, three Early Childhood Educators, and a cook.

# Notes from the Dak

First flown on 17 December 1933 at Clover Field in Santa Monica, California, the Douglas DC-3 is arguably one of the most successful aircraft ever built.

The RCAF acquired its first examples of the Dakota in 1943 and was used in various theatres including Canada, Europe and South East Asia. After World War II many RCAF Dakotas were passed on to Trans Canada Airlines. The Dakota was

the main RCAF post war transport until the arrival of more modern types like the CC-119 Boxcar, Northstar and Cosmo. In addition to the transport role the post war Dakota was operated in other roles including Search and Rescue, target tug and as an airborne navigation trainer for CF-104 Starfighter pilots. Aircraft configured for the role were given unique names like Dolly's Folly and Pinocchio. A total of 169 Dakota aircraft served in the post war RCAF with 76 remaining in service in 1969. In 1989 the last nine Dakotas were replaced by the CC/CT-142 Dash 8. (Information courtesy Bob Hurst...www.RCAF.com)

Much exciting progress to report from the Dakota Restoration Project being undertaken by the museum's team of volunteers at 10 Hangar! October saw the cosmetic restoration of the twin Pratt and Whitney R1830 engines completed and mounted on the wing box. The two props were then stripped and repainted with their installation now complete. Engine cowlings are being cleaned and painted ready for installation. November saw the mounting of the rudder which is now sheathed with aluminium replacing the old

fabric covered surfaces. The horizontal stabilizer is now ready for assembly.

A major problem is being addressed on the port wing. Starlings had found a hole in the skin and made nests between the ribs. Bird droppings being extremely caustic to aluminium, caused a lot of corrosion in this area. This is being descaled, some stringers are being replaced and new external skin is being readied.

The "cockpit crew" is hard at work detailing gauges and switches etc. bringing

the cockpit back to original condition.

The laborious task of the paint stripping is on going. As you can imagine, lots of square footage is presented by the Dak and environmental concerns must be addressed making this process one of the most difficult and time consuming.

The Dak crew consists of team leader Eric Welin, Chuck Calder, Bill Flinn, Russell Keddy, Bob McElman, Doc McKeil, Dave Richards and Brian Troniak.

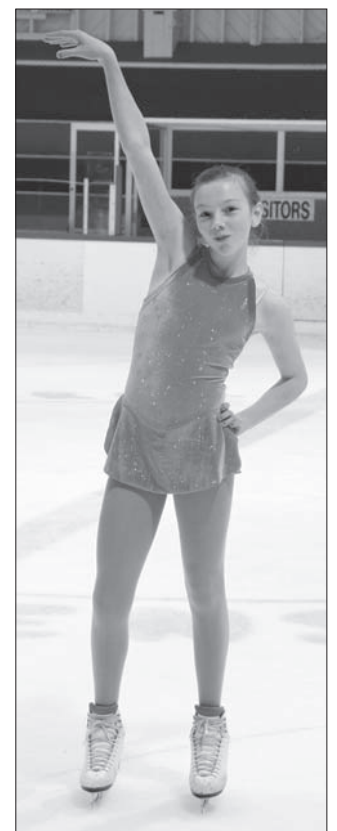

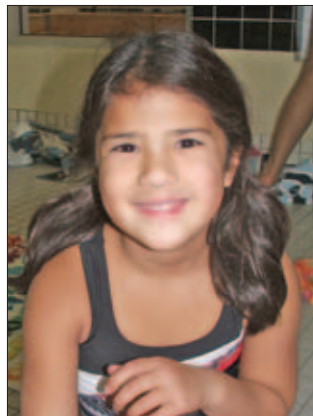
