## Update on the water situation at 14 Wing

Upon completion of a new water supply system, 14 Wing Greenwood expects to cease using potable water from the Municipality of the County of Kings by September 30.

A new deep-water supply well has successfully been drilled near the residential housing units on the east side of the base. This supply well will provide potable drinking water for the homes and the entire support side of the base. A \$500 000 contract has been awarded to Mid Valley Construction to install the necessary water pumping equipment and to connect the well head to the existing water distribution system. The project is ongoing, with completion anticipated by the end of July.

The construction of a second production well on the operations side of the base is in progress and is expected to be completed in September. A separate contract for the construction of the water distribution system will be tendered in the winter of 2012. Occupants of buildings on the operations side will continue to use bottled drinking water until the new well and associated connections are made to the distribution system. This project is expected to be completed by December 2013.

March 24, 2010, a Drinking Water Avoidance Advisory was issued due

to water sampling results from 14 Wing Greenwood that showed the presence of Perfluorooctane Sulfonate (PFOS) at levels above the Health Canada Guidance Value. In May 2010, the water advisory was lifted for parts of the wing hooked up to the Kings County municipal water system. 14 Wing Greenwood continued to upgrade its infrastructure and seek alternate, quality water supplies. The wing has conducted well drilling operations and water quality testing in several areas to determine the best location to construct supply wells for the base.

Groundwater quality with respect to PFOS continues to be monitored as part of the wing's overall environmental risk management program. Surface water quality in Zeke's Brook is also being monitored. Results to date indicate no apparent concerns associated with the aquatic life in the brook or the brook's recreational use by the public.

Ongoing testing continues to indicate groundwater outside of the wing's property has not been affected. The wing will continue to work closely on this issue with the Nova Scotia Environment Department, the Health Promotion and Protection Department of Nova Scotia, Health Canada and Environment Canada.

my heaviest weight. I had no trouble, I did all the marches – but I wouldn't say it was easy for me. And it wasn't good for me, my body or my health."

Woodford would have been called a jock through her younger years – she played every sport growing up in the Northwest Territories, then joined the Canadian Forces: "sports galore!"

Work and growing a family became time consuming, and she gradually dropped many of those activities. She picked up weight, and bad eating habits. In 2008, she was carrying an extra 100 pounds around, with an upcoming physical fitness test to get through.

"There is a pressure to maintain the image of the Canadian Forces, but I knew I wasn't the poster child," she says. "There has to be the standard, and I was meeting the standard."

She joined a Health Promotion weight wellness program, shedding 20 pounds and changing the way she coped with food cravings, handled a busy lifestyle – and even how she sat through the Stanley Cup playoffs.

The program ended, she relaxed, the fitness test loomed – and she regained the weight.

She turned to fitness instructors at the Fitness & Sports Centre, signing up for daily development sessions.

With the staff of health and fitness programs backing her, she achieved an exempt on her fitness test.

With two years before the next test, Woodford admits she "fell off the wagon," gaining back even more weight.

"You have to want it," she says, describing joining Weight Watchers in the fall of 2010, adding walking and weight training to her exercise program, then jogging on a treadmill.

Through all of this, Woodford played hockey: she went with a CF team to the first women's nationals in 2000, 60 pounds overweight, and her team won. She made it back

again in April of this year – for a number of years, she wasn't allowed to go without a successful fitness test - and won.

"At one of the first practices last fall, our goalie, Karen, said, 'Gee, Cindy, you sure picked up some speed.'"

She had: "Easy to do when there is 87 less pounds of you!"

Woodford has kept the weight off close to two years now.

"It's all positive: my team is very supportive, comments galore give you that boost of confidence, I feel better about myself.

"I started out in 2010 to make me happy with me – there's still work to do, but it's been good."

# État de la situation sur l'eau potable à la 14<sup>e</sup> Escadre

Maintenant que l'installation d'un nouveau système d'approvisionnement en eau est terminée à la 14<sup>e</sup> Escadre Greenwood, cette dernière devrait cesser de consommer l'eau potable fournie par la municipalité du comté de Kings d'ici le 30 septembre.

Un nouveau puits très profond a été foré à proximité des unités d'habitation résidentielles situées dans la partie est de la base. Ce puits permettra d'approvisionner en eau potable les maisons, de même que les services de soutien de

la base. Un contrat de 500 000 dollars a été attribué à Mid Valley Construction pour mettre en place l'équipement de pompage de l'eau et relier la tête de puits au système de distribution d'eau existant. Ce projet est en cours et devrait se terminer d'ici la fin du mois de juillet.

Le forage d'un second puits de production est en cours dans le secteur des opérations de la base et devrait être terminé en septembre 2012. Un contrat séparé pour la construction du nouveau système de distribution d'eau fera l'objet

d'un appel d'offres à l'hiver 2012. Les occupants des bâtiments situés dans le secteur des opérations continueront à boire de l'eau embouteillée jusqu'à ce que le nouveau puits et les conduites connexes soient reliés au nouveau système de distribution d'eau. Il est prévu que le projet sera achevé au mois de décembre 2013.

Le 24 mars 2010, un avis de non-consommation de l'eau potable a été émis à la suite d'une analyse d'échantillons effectuée à la base de la 14<sup>e</sup> Escadre Greenwood. Les résultats

indiquaient la présence d'un niveau de sulfonate de perfluorooctane (SPFO) se situant au-delà de la limite des normes établies par Santé Canada. Au mois de mai 2010, l'avis de non-consommation de l'eau a été levé dans les secteurs de la base qui étaient branchés à l'aqueduc de la municipalité du comté de Kings. Depuis, la 14<sup>e</sup> Escadre Greenwood continue d'apporter des améliorations à l'infrastructure et de chercher d'autres sources d'approvisionnement en eau de qualité. Le personnel de la 14<sup>e</sup> Escadre

a mené des opérations de forage et des analyses de qualité de l'eau dans plusieurs zones en vue de déterminer les emplacements les plus propices au forage de puits sur la base.

La qualité des eaux souterraines liée à la présence du SPFO continue d'être surveillée dans le cadre du programme global de gestion des risques environnementaux de l'Escadre. La qualité des eaux de surface dans le ruisseau Zeke est aussi sous surveillance, et les résultats n'indiquent jusqu'à maintenant rien de préoc-

cupant en apparence pour la faune et la flore aquatiques du ruisseau ou les utilisateurs récréatifs.

Des analyses répétées continuent à démontrer que les eaux souterraines à l'extérieur de la base n'ont pas été contaminées. L'Escadre continuera de collaborer étroitement à ce dossier avec le ministère de l'Environnement de la Nouvelle-Écosse, le ministère de la Promotion et de la Protection de la santé de la Nouvelle-Écosse, Santé Canada et Environnement Canada.

A CH-149 Cormorant helicopter from 103 (Search and Rescue) Squadron, Gander and a CC-130 Hercules aircraft from 413 (Transport and Rescue) Squadron, Greenwood, were involved May 9 in a medical evacuation for a crewmember aboard Spanish fishing vessel F/V Calvao, approximately 445 kilometres

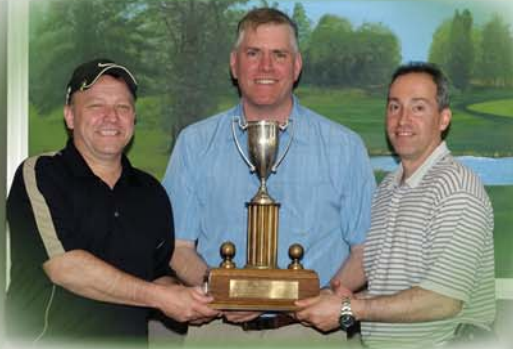

# International cooking, conference chance to make more of the job

Morgan McNeil has a different perspective on what many may see as a starter job. After attending the international convention for McDonald's restaurant franchisees, McNeil sees a career.

The 23-year-old spent a week at the end of April in Orlando, with 15,000 McDonald's owners, workers and industry partners.

"The owner here asked me if I'd like to work in Florida for a week," McNeil says, describing how Greenwood McDonald's owner Bob Smith presented the opportunity to him. "I said, 'Sure, if you want me to.'"

The work was an adventure: 70 Canadian McDonald's staff manned the Canada booth, cooking and running a classic McDonald's – international style. The challenge came as the five different international kitchens faced off: between 11 a.m. and 2 p.m., how many customers could be served?

"Every day, Canada won. We served 600 people day one and, on the last day, we broke a record: 1,044 people in an hour – 2,892 in three

hours. We were flying.

"Everyone just loves the Canada booth, and we've won the last two or three conventions. We're the most friendly, we're the fastest kitchen. When we were close, we were out on the street urging people to come inside."

Along with the glory, McNeil and the Canadian team had VIP passes at the conference concert, with Kelly Clarkson, Keith Urban, Seal and other big-name entertainers on stage.

When not in the kitchen, McNeil had a chance to take in some of the conference sessions and exhibits. Nine football field lengths' of displays and sessions, featuring new uniforms, campaigns, supplier showcases, play land manufacturers: "It was amazing, seeing how big the corporation is. It was so much fun, and I had a blast.

"What started out as a 'get-by' job is turning into a career. There are a lot of opportunities."

McNeil finished Horton High and attended a two-year accounting program at Nova Scotia Community College. His high school and college job included 40-hour work weeks, and McDonald's was

flexible.

"My whole family has worked here – my brother is store manager in New Minas, my sister hired me. It's always been a fun place for me."

McNeil has been with McDonald's in Greenwood for about six months, now working as the acting assistant

store manager. He's in a position to interview new employees, and sees the same early expectations from them for a "get by" job.

"I can see how people will be, but the training here is so great, the work ethic is engrained, there are always courses and opportunities for development."

# Big year ahead for museum

## Aircraft, events – artefacts and people tell aviation history

Major Bob Johnson has the best job: he relives the past, experiences the modern and gets a glimpse of what Canada's Air Force could be every day, as 14 Wing Greenwood's heritage officer.

All of it is on display at the Greenwood Military Aviation Museum, and it's only going to get better.

"This museum tells a story, and we get a lot of kudos. We tell the story of what these artefacts are, and we get lots of positive feedback from people."

In 2012, the 70<sup>th</sup> anniversary of 14 Wing Greenwood, the museum is making some big moves forward.

Tied with the anniversary is a developing visit from the Canadian Yellow Wings vintage planes July 25 to 31. Three were supposed to visit in 2011: only one made it, due to mechanical issues with the restored – but cantankerous – aircraft. Making up for that in July will be a visiting Harvard, Tiger Moth, Fleet Finch and Cornell.

"These are 50- to 60-year old planes, and would have been known very well around Greenwood – all British Commonwealth training planes."

A potential ground display

of the planes, and some flights for base-identified deserving personnel, would highlight a potential anniversary open house event in Greenwood.

In the meantime, the museum's final restoration work on a four-year project to preserve a Dakota is underway, with 14 Air Maintenance Support crews doing the last paint work. Museum volunteers spent hours getting the plane to this point, and the end result will move to the museum this summer.

If an extension project goes ahead as planned, the completed Anson restoration will also move to an indoor display at the north end of the museum building this fall.

Johnson is also working on projects to see a quad radar from 14 Wing's airfield make a move to his airpark, something that would have been in place here since the 1940s and used up until a few short months ago. A T-bird start cart, used to turn over the electrically-started planes, is also a possibility. A fuel bowser (tender), a vintage fire truck, an H-44 "flying banana" rescue helicopter that predates the Labrador and a 96-inch wing span balsa Beaufighter model – "the Germans used to call it 'whistling death,'" John

says – are also on the list.

"The H-44, that'll be about four or five years of restoration work and then we'll put it on display. Helicopters are not a very common thing, and we'll have the 44 and our Lab, both used in the rescue world. To have them both side by side in a museum is quite a coup – these are Canadian service

aircraft."

The Beaufighter model will hang from the roof as you enter the museum, and volunteers are rigging it with sensors to activate laser lights as visitors pass by.

"It's called the 'wow' factor," Johnson says. "Going after ships was its job."

Putting people in Canada's

aviation history is what the museum staff and volunteers strive for: an ejection seat you can sit in, with a video replaying an F-18 in-flight exit at hand; the engine thrum and radio squawk as a model crew works inside a plane cavity; documentaries, reading material, uniforms, specialized equipment torn apart to show detail.

"Stuff comes in all the time. We're moving forward with the museum, and our acquisitions collection. We have lots of challenges, but the museum is a worthwhile effort. We have phenomenal support from the wing, the driving force is our volunteers – they live for it. They are both why we are able to do what we do."

# Grosse année à venir pour le Musée

Le Major Bob Johnson a un emploi sans pareil : il revit le passé, fait l'expérience de la modernité et voit ce que pourrait devenir la Force aérienne du Canada tous les jours, à titre d'officier du patrimoine de la 14<sup>e</sup> Escadre Greenwood.

Tout cela est en montre au Musée de l'aviation militaire de Greenwood, et les choses ne font qu'aller de mieux en mieux.

« Ce musée raconte une histoire, et nous recevons beaucoup de félicitations.

Nous racontons l'histoire derrière tous ces artefacts, et nous recevons beaucoup de commentaires positifs des gens. »

En 2012, année du 70<sup>e</sup> anniversaire de la 14<sup>e</sup> Escadre Greenwood, le musée se prépare à accomplir de grandes choses.

Dans le cadre des célébrations de l'anniversaire, on travaille à organiser une visite des Avions jaunes canadiens d'époque du 25 au 31 juillet. Ils devaient nous visiter en 2011, mais un seul a pu le faire, en raison de problèmes mécaniques qu'éprouvent

parfois les avions restaurés – mais capricieux. Pour compenser, nous recevons la visite en juillet d'un Harvard, d'un Tiger Moth, d'un Fleet Finch et d'un Cornell.

« Il s'agit là d'avions qui ont de 50 à 60 ans, et qui auraient été en terrain très connu ici à Greenwood – ce sont tous des avions d'entraînement du Commonwealth britannique. »

Une possibilité d'exposition au sol des aéronefs et certains vols pour des membres du personnel méritants de la base seraient les faits saillants d'une activité portes ouvertes potentielle pour souligner

l'anniversaire de Greenwood.

D'ici là, les derniers travaux d'un projet de restauration d'un Dakota qui s'étend sur quatre ans se poursuivent, et les équipes de maintenance aérienne de la 14<sup>e</sup> Escadre procèdent aux dernières touches de peinture. Les bénévoles du musée ont passé des heures et des heures à restaurer l'aéronef, et le fruit de leur travail sera en montre au musée dès cet été.

Si le projet d'agrandissement se déroule comme prévu, l'Anson complètement restauré sera aussi mis en montre à l'intérieur, dans la

partie nord du musée, dès cet automne.

Le Maj Johnson travaille aussi à des projets visant à déménager à l'aéroparc du musée un radar Quad du terrain d'aviation de la 14<sup>e</sup> Escadre, où de tels radars se trouvent depuis les années 1940 et où ils y étaient encore utilisés voilà à peine quelques mois. Un chariot de départ T-bird, qui servait à faire tourner les avions à démarrage électrique, est aussi une possibilité. Un camion ravitailleur, un camion à incendie d'époque, un hélicoptère de sauvetage H-44 surnommé la « banane

volante » qui a précédé le Labrador et un modèle réduit d'une envergure de 96 pouces en balsa d'un Beaufighter – « les Allemands l'appelaient « la mort sifflante », explique le Maj Johnson – sont aussi sur la liste.

« Le H-44 nécessitera environ quatre ou cinq années de travaux de restauration, et nous pourrions ensuite le mettre en montre. Les hélicoptères ne sont pas des choses très répandues, et nous aurons le 44 et notre Labrador, tous deux utilisés

# Flight program marks decade at museum

The Greenwood Military Aviation Museum contributes to Valley school's Grade 6 science of flight programs with guided tours every Wednesday morning from January to April. April 14 marked 10 years of the flight education program at the museum.

Tours are conducted by about 20 military veteran volunteers and some serving Royal Canadian Air Force members, all with extensive experience and knowledge in military aviation. They provide a hands-on learning experience for the students: the museum is not just a collection of dusty artifacts but a vibrant, progressive organization. The program covers a wide

spectrum of aviation history and technological topics: 14 Wing and air force history, aircraft flight instruments and controls, theory of flight, aircraft characteristics and design; aircrew and ground crew duties, engines, propellers and jets; computer flight simulation; anti-submarine warfare and the Cold War, simulators, helicopters, parachutes and the role of search and rescue. Worthy of note, the 14 Wing Greenwood base is celebrating its 70th anniversary this year.

What keeps volunteers, teachers and students coming back is the realization of what an excellent historical and educational resource the museum is for the wider community. The program offers students an early opportunity to visit a museum - many for the first time - and exposes them to a

wide variety of military history and related technology that has been part of the fabric of the Valley for over 70 years. It brings the school's flight syllabus to life, up close, in greater detail than can be done in the classroom. This is an outstanding example of the military/ civilian com-

munity cooperation that can be achieved with experienced, knowledgeable volunteers and interested teachers and students motivating each other about. The insightful written thanks from students makes the veterans proud of their contribution to their education. This year alone, instructors

logged some 647 hours in the museum. Some travel from as far away as the Gaspereau Valley and Trout Lake weekly to participate. The positive, inquisitive, energetic atmosphere the students, staff and parents bring to the museum is reward enough for volunteers; hopefully, a spark of interest will be

ignited in some of these young students to pursue a career in a very wide range of technology associated with aviation.

This year, seven schools participated in nine sessions. Some 478 students, teachers and escorts completed the program, for a 10-year total of 4,664 participants.

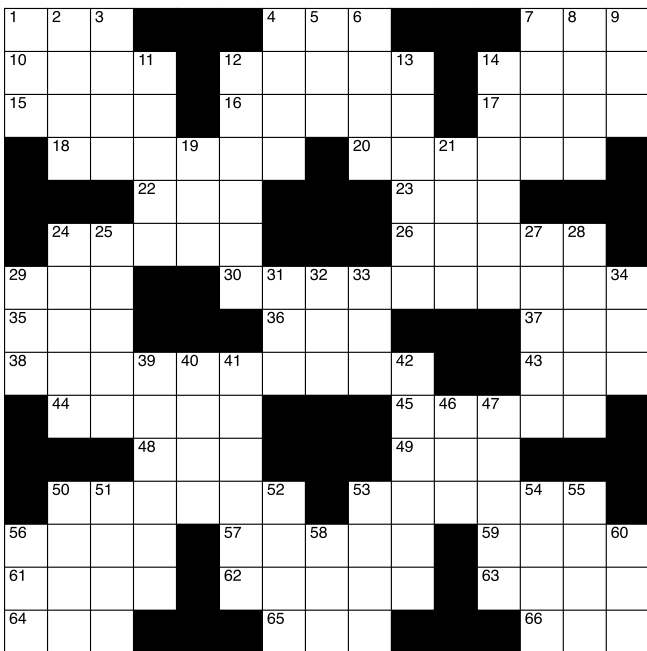
