60<sup>th</sup> year on the throne this year.

The Greenwood Military Aviation Museum is planning a special public display October 16, and its neighbour, the Flight Line Café, will host an afternoon tea to compliment the event.

"Queen Elizabeth visited Greenwood in 1976, part of a Canadian tour – I was an 18-year-old glider pilot here at the time, and I remember we were grounded while her plane was in the air," says Major Bob

Johnson, 14 Wing's heritage officer and head of the museum.

There are some mementos of the Queen's presence, and Johnson and museum staff will gather other pertinent artefacts from the museum's collection, particularly those that link Canada's military aviation heritage with Britain.

"The royal family has a deep appreciation for Canada's contributions in the Second World War," says Johnson, pointing to this summer's unveiling of a memorial to Canada's Bomber Command in London.

Johnson is looking for public donations or lendings of memorabilia associated with the Queen's coronation, reign and jubilee to include in the display. If you have items to contribute – scrapbooks, photos, commemorative ware or other collectibles – contact Johnson at 765-1494 ext 1640, before October 10.

Karen Taylor at the Flight Line Café is also looking for help with the tea, as she's planning themed centrepieces and a bit of a formal opening at 2 p.m., before the freewill offering tea gets underway at 2:30 p.m. A silent auction will also be held in support of both the museum and the Military Police and firefighters' Blind Fund for Children. Donations would be gratefully accepted.

## Base work, life big Valley opportunity

Lieutenant-Colonel Heber Gillam welcomed Valley business leaders to the "federal town" of CFB Greenwood September 12.

Gillam, the wing administration officer, represents

the base on the board of the Annapolis Valley Chamber of Commerce. The AVCC's directors met in the conference room of CANEX for their regular meeting, but added time for a base briefing and tour of the Greenwood Military Aviation Museum.

"Our wing commander is

the mayor, the warden, the chief executive officer of a large corporation – the Greenwood base is a town, and he's responsible for it, and all the rules and regulations" that go along with it, Gillam said, listing all the environmental, health and safety, contracting, recreation, family services,

health care and workforce issues addressed every day, 365 days a year.

"And, this is a 70-year-old town, so it's quite a challenge."

14 Wing Public Affairs Officer Captain John Pulchny led the briefing, describing the squadrons, operations and workforce based at CFB

# Aurora Block 3 operational testing continues in Hawaii

14 Wing Greenwood's Maritime Proving & Evaluation Unit is finishing off the year-long Initial Operational Test and Evaluation (IOT&E) portion of the Block 3 certification process. The operational testing of the Block 3 Aurora has recently passed some major milestones.

In July, an MP&EU crew deployed to Kaneohe Bay, Oahu, Hawaii, for the largest maritime exercise in the world. RIMPAC (Rim of the Pacific) is held by the United States every even year during the summer. This exercise included participants

from 22 nations, with 42 ships, six submarines, 200 aircraft and a total of 25,000 personnel.

The Block 3 aircraft was tested in two main roles: anti-submarine warfare and anti-surface operations. During 13 exercise flights, the crew was able to fly against various real world targets, including six submarines and a carrier task force, which provided invaluable test and evaluation data. The lessons learned at RIMPAC 2012 have helped to develop new Block 3 operating procedures and provide valuable feedback to the equipment contractors.

The past year has been an exciting time for MP&EU, as many of the required IOT&E

sorties have been flown. The next few months will include flying any remaining IOT&E

Block 3 test flights in the Greenwood area. MP&EU now needs to collate these results and then

issue its final report on IOT&E in the upcoming weeks. The unit will then turn its attention

to conducting follow on testing of the more advanced aspects of the Block 3 Aurora.

Greenwood. He also emphasized the quality of life that "sells" Greenwood postings to Canadian Forces members across Canada.

"The Annapolis Valley is a sought after posting, and for retirements," Pulchny said.

14 Wing's people and operations make a big impact: the annual overall economic spin-off is between \$110 million and \$160 million every year.

"Our people are well-trained, they are competitive, they travel a lot and have a lot of variety and interests. They will go where the goods are: education, medical care – or simply groceries. Halifax is only an hour's drive away, and they'll go."

Pulchny said the enticement of discounts at hundreds of Halifax-area businesses for its own military community – which are available for Greenwood personnel as well – is

another influence.

On the other hand, the Valley's quality of life plays a big part in Greenwood's military community.

"Our people are extremely involved in the local community – the PTAs, sports, churches, clubs," Pulchny said. "We also have activities here at the base that support the community – our health clinic for military families, a fitness and sports centre, a community centre...."

Gillam said the base's motto, "Operate as One," plays out in the community.

"Greenwood has got to be the strongest wing I've ever attended for partnerships with its community," he said.

There are still challenges – the same as those that face a town, Gillam said: finding doctors, finding childcare, finding jobs for spouses and dependents whose own professional careers are uprooted with every military posting; sorting

out schools and, for the base itself, finding resources in the wider community to meet infrastructure demands.

"All of this gives you, the Valley community, the op-

portunity to find new people and ideas," Gillam said, along with meeting the base's operations and personnel's economic, support and daily living needs.

# 14 Wing drivers' safety skills tested at national 'roadeo'

CFB Shearwater hosted the Canadian Forces Safe Driving Championship August 25 to 29. More commonly known as "the roadeo," this was the second year in a row for Halifax to host this event.

The aim of the competition is to foster safety and encourage all military and civilian drivers to develop and perfect their professional driving skills and provide an environment in which to demonstrate these skills in a friendly but challenging competition. More than 190 participants came from across Canada, representing the four regions: Atlantic, Eastern, Central and Western; and 78 competitors competed. Team Atlantic was comprised of competitors, administrative & logistics staff as well as judges from 3 ASG Gagetown, CFB

Halifax, 14 Wing Greenwood and LFAA Reserve Units.

The competitors competed in one of the following vehicle categories: tractor trailer, 5 tonne straight truck, Heavy Logistics Vehicle Wheeled (HLVW), 40 passenger bus or the Route Discipline. The first day of competition started with a written test, followed by a physical vehicle inspection test on the vehicle they competed in. The remaining days were spent showcasing their driving skills.

Corporal Gary Spinney represented 14 Wing Greenwood in the 40 passenger bus event and demonstrated his impressive driving skills on the course, bringing home the trophy for first place. The bus trophy will be on display at Greenwood's Transportation and Electrical and Mechanical Engineering Squadron until next year's competition. As the first place

winner, Spinney is automatically eligible to compete in next year's competition.

Private Kyle Pelletier represented 14 Wing in the HLVW event and demonstrated even people on Air Force bases can still do an exceptional job operating army trucks. Although he did not win a trophy, he is eager to enhance his skills and compete again next year.

Privates Trevor Burchell and Jose Pinto represented 14 Wing in the Route Discipline event, different from the other events as it uses navigation skills and the use and marking of map coordinates. At check points, they were required to carry out various scenarios, varying from the proper techniques to boost a vehicle to identifying airbrake components - and even some

first aid. This was their first time competing at the CFSDC and both gained a great deal of knowledge and experience.

# CF 'right choice' for new recruit

You'd think someone with a mother, father and brother in the Canadian Forces would have an idea what military life is like.

Chelsea Doyle, 21, is one of 14 Wing Greenwood's newest privates, a Reservist who signed on February 10 and is just back from three months of basic training.

"I might have thought of the military when I was young, but then there are boyfriends, school, the dread of postings – and I've come kind of full circle now, realizing the positives," Doyle says.

"The military is an amazing institution, and I never really thought that."

Doyle's mom is Warrant Officer Cheryl Doyle, and her dad is Corporal Barry Doyle – both Reservists. Her brother, Johnathan, is a captain, recently posted to Petewawa as an avionics system technician. That's not all: her other brother, Adam, an engineer in Kentucky, is also in the process of applying to join the forces.

"It would be fun if we were all blue," Doyle says. "It's not common, but you do see families like that."

She credits the move to the military with an upbringing backed by military values. While her parents had common backgrounds they brought to their marriage when they met in Summerside, the "style of life," Doyle says, she grew up in meant there may have been a little more "eye-to-eye" parenting than in other families.

After graduating from West Kings three years ago, Doyle wanted to take a year off. With lots of people advising her "once you take a year off, you never go back," she started nursing that fall at Dalhousie University.

"That was a wake up call for me – it wasn't really for me."

She transferred to Mount St. Vincent and took a second year in public relations before getting the time she wanted: her year off studies.

"My parents weren't upset – they knew I was motivated and wouldn't just sit around. I knew I wasn't in the right mind frame, and that carried

over through those two years at university. I knew I wanted it, and I knew I'd go."

During the break, her mom talked to her about military options, and Doyle applied for the regular force. "Nothing was happening," and she learned the Reserves were hiring, so she resubmitted her name there. In November, she started getting calls for further details and, February 10, her parents and brother joined her at 14 Wing's headquarters' lobby for her enlistment. She was assigned to 405 Squadron as a resource management support clerk 12 days a month, while awaiting the call for basic training.

"Basic training is a game, a three-month interview to see if you're cut out for this the rest of your life – not everyone is. It really pushes your buttons."

Always an athlete, Doyle had no trouble with the physical requirements of the course – she even lost 40 pounds, and she enjoyed drill – "it's not fun under two-and-a-half hours of sun, but when it looks good, it looks good." She was surprised by the amount of classroom time, and the his-

tory of Canada, its military and the work done international by CF personnel made a personal impact.

"Risk – it's the first thing they teach you about. There's not a thought in my mind about risk right now, but my brother was in Afghanistan, and I'm sure he thought of it. It also gave me a different perspective of what my parents'

views must have been then.

"I'm prepared: I think, if it's for the greater good, I'm ready."

Doyle is heading to her three-month RMS training course September 25, but continues to keep an eye out for the opportunity to transfer to the regular force. She'd love to be a pilot, or work in air traffic control; she'd also like

to finish her university degree, perhaps in business-based courses.

"I'm right in my choice," she says. "People should tell you more about Canada's military, what we've done for the world, the humanitarian and peacekeeping work, and the opportunities for a career. Joining has made me feel proud."

## Les FC : le bon choix pour une nouvelle recrue

On pourrait croire qu'une personne dont la mère, le père et le frère sont dans les Forces canadiennes a une bonne idée de ce qu'est la vie militaire.

Chelsea Doyle, une jeune femme de 21 ans, est l'un des plus récents soldats de la 14<sup>e</sup> Escadre Greenwood, une réserviste qui s'est enrôlée le 10 février et qui revient tout juste de son instruction élé-

mentaire de trois mois.

« Il aurait pu me venir à l'esprit de m'enrôler quand j'étais plus jeune, mais il y a les copains, l'école et la peur des affectations. Maintenant, j'ai fait mon bout de chemin et je me rends compte des aspects positifs, explique Doyle.

L'armée est une institution incroyable, et je n'avais jamais vraiment pensé cela. »

La mère de Doyle est l'adjudant Cheryl Doyle et son père est le caporal Barry Doyle, tous deux des réservistes. Son frère Johnathan est capitaine et a récemment été affecté à

Petawawa à titre de technicien en systèmes avioniques. Ce n'est pas tout, car son autre frère, Adam, ingénieur au Kentucky, a également entamé le processus pour se joindre aux forces.

« Ce serait amusant que nous soyons tous enrôlés, avance Doyle. Ce n'est pas fréquent, mais on le voit dans certaines familles. »

Selon elle, sa motivation à s'enrôler lui vient d'avoir été élevée selon les valeurs militaires. Bien que ses parents venaient d'un même milieu qu'ils ont apporté à leur ma-

riage lorsqu'ils se sont rencontrés à Summerside, le « mode de vie » dans lequel Doyle a grandi comportait une attitude un peu plus d'égal à égal que dans d'autres familles.

Après avoir terminé ses études à West Kings il y a trois ans, Doyle a voulu prendre une année de congé. Comme beaucoup de personnes l'ont avertie qu'après une année sabbatique, on ne revenait jamais, elle a commencé des études en soins infirmiers l'automne même à l'Université Dalhousie.

« Ça a été la réalisation – ce domaine n'était vraiment pas fait pour moi. »

Elle s'est par la suite inscrite à Mount St. Vincent pour une seconde année en relations publiques avant de faire ce qu'elle désirait : prendre une année de congé de ses études.

« Mes parents n'étaient pas fâchés, car ils savaient que j'étais motivée et que je ne perdrais pas mon temps. Je savais que je n'étais pas dans

le bon état d'esprit, et c'est resté ainsi pendant mes deux années d'université. Je savais que je voulais partir. »

Pendant ce congé, sa mère lui a parlé des options militaires, et Doyle a fait une demande pour la Force régulière. « Rien ne bougeait de ce côté-là », lorsqu'elle a appris que la Force de réserve embauchait, alors elle y a fait une demande aussi. En novembre, elle a commencé à recevoir des appels lui demandant davantage de détails, et le 10 février, ses parents et son frère l'ont accompagnée au quartier général de la 14<sup>e</sup> Escadre pour son enrôlement. Elle a été assignée au 405<sup>e</sup> Escadron à titre de commis de soutien à la gestion des ressources 12 jours par mois en attendant de suivre son instruction de base.

« L'instruction de base est un jeu, une entrevue de trois mois pour voir si la personne est prête à vivre ainsi toute sa vie – ce n'est pas tout le monde qui l'est. L'instruction



# Maritime employers see Army Reservists in action

August 11, more than a dozen civic leaders and civilian employers of Army Reservists from across the Maritimes visited Camp Aldershot for a hands-on experience of what Reserve soldiers do in their time away from the office.

The one-day event, hosted by the Canadian Forces Liaison Council, was part of the

ExecuTrek Program. In addition to briefings about Camp Aldershot and the work of Army Reservists, the visitors fired a C9 light machine gun and viewed a section attack demonstration by some of the Reserve soldiers currently employed at Camp Aldershot.

The ExecuTrek Program gives employers, supervisors and human resources professionals a first-hand view of the quality of military training and the benefits employers can gain from that training:

leadership, trade skills, general work and management skills, values, work ethics and much more.

"When an employer understands what they are getting back, it's worthwhile," explained Lieutenant-Colonel Marcel Boudreau, one of CFLC's liaison officers in Nova Scotia.

Sometimes that means being flexible with work hours.

"I'm glad we can help them out with their schedule to be a part of it (the Reserves),"

said Rob Moreland, sales manager, PepsiCo Beverages Canada in Halifax. Moreland is the civilian employer of Chief Warrant Officer Ron Lawrence, regimental sergeant-major of the West Nova Scotia Regiment and an Army Reservist for 34 years.

Moreland applauded the people who work at a civilian job, but also find time to commit to life as a Reservist.

"It's amazing... how much work it is and how much they dedicate to it," said Moreland.

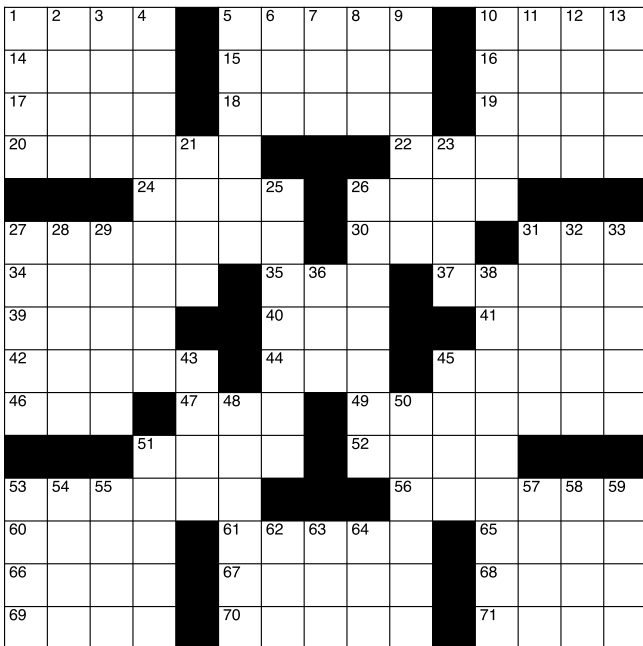



# Ready to race

It can be competitive, it can be challenging, but the organizer of this year's Adventure Challenge says the September 28 race can also be something people have entered "for themselves.

"They can say after, it's something they've done," Master Warrant Officer Keith Mitchell says. "Our goal is to build teamwork

and camaraderie and, hopefully, inspire people to try something a little different."

The 40-kilometre challenge includes a five-kilometre run from 14 Wing Greenwood by four people, then a mountain bike stretch to Cloud Lake.

"Then, there's a choice: two people continue in a canoe, and two bike – this is where the fifth person on the team becomes integral," filling in a support role with extra gear and transport of the canoeists' bikes.

Throw in a zipline, some map and compass, stripping and then assembling both a C7 and a 9 millimetre firearm, and you've got a multi-skill challenge.



"You're Canadian Forces members – you should be able to do this," Mitchell says, adding the race isn't designed for ultramarathoners – "just people winning to compete."

The race info has been out since January to give everyone interested a "heads up" on the details" the route, the challenges, the distances, the requirements.

"There are no surprises, so people should have had lots of time to train."

To date, eight teams have regis-

tered, and there are another couple that could be last minute entries, Mitchell expects. Any Department of National Defense employee at 14 Wing may enter, and other wings and bases could also send a team if they're interested in the challenge.

A dozen volunteers have covered the route – which Mitchell expects could be completed between three and six hours, depending on the racing team; organized for first aid and skills stations and planned checkpoints. The race goes rain or shine.
