Storage compound set for September 18

A new compound for long-term storage of recreational vehicles will be ready for use September 18.

The former site, along Ad Astra Way, closed September 3 to allow the expansion of a fire training area for 14 Wing Fire and Protective Services personnel.

The new site is located just west of the base's salt domes, off Thunderbird Way on the way to the Greenwood Golf Course. It will be managed by staff at the 14 Wing Greenwood Community Centre.

"This kind of compound and service is commonly looked after at other bases across Canada by PSP (Personnel Support Programs)," says community centre director Jill Jackson.

She says the new fenced area features gravelled lots in varying sizes, and can accommodate 30 parked vehicles. Rental fees will reflect the size of the lot a user requires.

People who would like space in the compound will have to leave contact information, a vehicle description and proof of insurance with the community centre office. They will be placed on a key access list so they can access the site as needed.

For further information on the compound and use arrangements, contact the community centre at 765-1494 local 5331, or drop in the Church Street office.

Band makes a big noise 14 Wing musicians march on at international event

The sweet sounds of success for 14 Wing Greenwood's bands are being heard farther afield.

Forty-five members of the Pipes & Drums and Brass and Reed bands combined to be the first volunteer-member military band invited to the 15th Quebec City International Festival of Military

Bands the week of August 21.

"With Youtube, and the military music branch being small, the music director of the Van Doos (the regimental band of the Royal 22^e Régiment) who is also the music

director of the festival saw videos of our Sunset Ceremony last summer," says Warrant Officer Vincent Roy, 14 Wing's bandmaster – and a former Van Doos band member himself.

The tape told the tale: 14 Wing's bands can play, know how to put a show together and they're more than a Mess, ceremonial or street parade band.

"We don't march a lot, but we practiced for the Sunset Ceremony, we have people at different levels of marching experience in both bands, and people help each other."

While all members of the bands are volunteer musicians (overseen by Roy and two other military personnel), there is a mix of Regular and Reserve force and civilians, from Digby to Wolfville, and from as far as the South Shore. They range in age from 18 to in their 70s.

"We are a bit special – there are no volunteer military bands in Quebec, and just a handful across Canada," Roy says, "and, when we combine our pipes and drums with the concert band instruments, there is lots of interest."

The Quebec invitation and eventual performance were close to a year in the mak-

ing, as travel and funding arrangements are always a challenge. The last time Greenwood's band travelled to a similar event was Bermuda in 2005.

In Quebec, Greenwood performed alongside military bands from such countries as Belgium, Chile, Russia and France. A Thursday evening outdoor performance at Place George V was a highlight, with light rain but thousands of people arriving hours early with chairs for the evening. A few 45-minute concerts over the weekend in the Old City, performing the music for the highly ceremonial Changing of the Guard at the Citadelle

de Quebec – normally a daily Van Doos' duty, and a grand street parade through the Old City made for a memorable experience.

"People went crazy for us – we had some new music, and we combine it with the pipes. When we explained to the crowds we were all volunteer except for three of us, people were surprised."

Roy himself is proud of the band.

"It's something to walk up on a big stage with lots of lights and microphones – this was 'out of our backyard'," he says. "People were really nervous, but I knew, with the calibre of people we have,

they would step up and focus. I knew the band could do it, and I think it was even better than I expected."

The experience was a definite perk for band members after a busy summer of 14 Wing Greenwood ceremonies, community parades from the June Apple Blossom Festival on and the second, successful Sunset Ceremony in August.

"But the experience also keeps our people keen and interested, and it's a chance for professional music development. It's also a nice recognition for the support we receive from the base to do what we do."

Chilli, a mock jail, dressing with a difference – all the fun, and the charitable intention behind it, is ready for a big kick off September 13.

14 Wing Greenwood will launch its annual Combined Charities campaign as part of the Terry Fox Run on Church Street: once run participants complete their warm-up and get their route pointers, Combined Charities' committee

volunteers will introduce this year's \$50,000 fundraising goal.

"Last year was really good," says committee co-chair Captain James Murdock. "We met our goal to raise \$50,000, and we did really well."

With the successful freewill BBQ at the August Sunset Ceremony, Combined Charities is already well on its way to this year's target.

The Combined Charities season runs from the first of September to the end of

December, and includes many extraordinary events focused on raising funds for dozens of non-profit programs close to wing personnel's hearts. Breakfast programs, health causes, kids' sports, animal welfare groups and more all benefit from a share of the end result.

To get there, though, a committee of volunteers will be encouraging their peers to join them in the challenge. Dress-with-a-difference twoonie collection started with the Sep-

tember 6 Friday, as uniformed personnel get a chance to wear civvies to work – for just a couple of bucks. The first big event on the schedule will be the annual mega-potluck at the Annapolis Mess October 25, with its decorated unit tables, themed food and the high-profile commanding officers' chilli cook-off. Last year's jail-your-boss event will be added to the fun. November 29 and 30 will be the annual Festival of Trees display and silent auction at the Annapolis

Mess, a hugely popular decorating challenge in itself – and well-attended because of the range and quality of prizes to be won.

The easiest way for 14 Wing to meet its target is through the pay allotment program. Committee members have a form military personnel may use to join, indicating how much they'd like to give from each pay through the campaign season. They may also designate their individual donation to particular beneficia-

ries on the Combined Charities donor list, or any registered charity of their choice.

Combined Charities is part of the wider Wing Charity which, in 2012, raised over \$127,000 for non-profit programs here in the Valley and farther afield. The base tracks as many individual and unit fundraising projects throughout the year to come up with this total. Relay for Life, Movember and Terry Fox fundraising stand out on the annual base calendar.

Du chili, une prison simulée et une tenue décontractée – du plaisir assuré dans un esprit de bienfaisance. Nous voilà donc prêts pour le lancement du 13 septembre.

La 14^e Escadre Greenwood lancera sa Campagne annuelle pour le programme des œuvres de bienfaisance dans le cadre de la course Terry Fox, rue Church : après que les participants auront fait leur échauffement et obtenu des indications du trajet, les bénévoles du comité des œuvres de bienfaisance parleront de l'objectif visé de 50 000 \$ qui a été fixé cette année.

« Nous avons très bien fait l'an dernier » a affirmé le coprésident, le Capitaine James Murdock. « Nous avons

recueilli les 50 000 \$ que nous nous étions fixés comme objectif, et nous avons obtenu de très bons résultats. »

Grâce au succès qu'a connu le barbecue lors de la cérémonie du crépuscule qui a eu lieu au mois d'août, la campagne des œuvres de bienfaisance se trouve déjà bien entamée. Nous avons les coudées franches pour atteindre notre objectif.

La campagne des œuvres de bienfaisance commence le 1^{er} septembre et se termine à la fin du mois de décembre. De nombreuses activités sont prévues pour nous permettre d'amasser des fonds pour une douzaine de programmes sans but lucratif qui occupent une place privilégiée dans le cœur de l'Escadre. Des programmes de petits-déjeuners, des causes pour la santé, des activités sportives pour les jeunes, des

groupes pour la défense du bien-être des animaux, et autant de causes pour un partage des fonds qui seront recueillis.

Pour y arriver, un comité de bénévoles encouragera leurs collègues à se joindre à eux pour relever ce défi. L'activité « Tenue décontractée » à deux dollars a commencé le vendredi 6 septembre, une journée durant laquelle les membres du personnel qui portent l'uniforme ont l'occasion de s'habiller en civil pour travailler, au coût modique de deux dollars. La première activité importante à l'horaire sera le méga repas-partage au Mess Annapolis, le 25 octobre. Les tables seront décorées, des mets à thème seront servis et le populaire concours de

chili des commandants sera lancé. L'activité « prison pour le patron » viendra s'ajouter au plaisir des participants. Les journées du 29 et 30 novembre seront consacrées à l'exposition et à l'encan silencieux du Festival des arbres au Mess Annapolis, dont la décoration des arbres est des plus populaires et des plus courues en raison de la variété et de la qualité des prix à remporter.

Pour la 14^e Escadre Greenwood, le programme de délégitimation de solde est le moyen le plus facile d'atteindre l'objectif fixé. Les membres du comité ont un formulaire que peuvent remplir les militaires désireux d'apporter leur contribution. Il suffit d'indiquer le montant à prélever pour la durée de la

campagne. Ils peuvent aussi désigner comme bénéficiaire de leur don des organismes particuliers dont le nom est inscrit sur la liste des œuvres de bienfaisance regroupées, ou tout autre organisme de bienfaisance enregistré de leur choix.

Les œuvres groupées font partie de la grande œuvre caritative de l'Escadre laquelle, en 2012, a permis de re-

cueillir 127 000 \$ pour des programmes sans but lucratif ici, dans la Vallée, et ailleurs également. La base réussit à rassembler suffisamment de projets de collecte de fonds pendant l'année pour recueillir ce montant. Le Relais pour la vie, Movember et la course Terry Fox sont les principales activités de financement inscrites au programme de chaque année.

Wing in a 'positive' place

If there is anywhere most likely for Colonel Iain Huddleston to call "home," he can make a good argument for Greenwood.

Huddleston took on command of the base and wing July 18 and is settling into his new role on some old stomping grounds: he spent seven years here in past postings.

"I was born in Germany,

and my Dad was military, so I've lived in Belgium, Toronto, Ottawa, North Bay, St. Hubert, Cold Lake..." Huddleston says. At 17, he himself walked into Le Collège militaire royal du Canada to begin his own military career, and begin his own peripatetic life.

"When people ask me where I'm from, I don't really have an answer – my Mom is from Shelburne (here in Nova Scotia) and my Dad was from Scotland. My Greenwood postings are the longest I've been in one place."

He doesn't think it's "weird," al-

though he can list the negatives and positives associated with a military life of moves, new experiences, friends left behind, distant family, exposure to cultures and histories.

But, for the next two years at least, life is here. His wife, Amanda's, parents are in Greenwood, and his parents are on the South Shore – great for them and their two young children.

In just a few weeks, Huddleston has a good feeling about Greenwood, describing it as a "more positive place" than he'd seen years ago.

"We have national recognition for the quality of our Residential Housing Units and our programs for service and support for our people. We've taken a huge step in the last couple of years into the forefront of ISR (intelligence, sur-

veillance and reconnaissance), we've had a big impact on the Air Force's Arctic campaign. Our search and rescue capability continues to answer the call with highly trained professionals. We're becoming more visible, everyone's got ideas – and they're being listened to. That's happening."

He intends to continue that. He has, as yet, no particular personal goals or landmarks he'd like to see targeted during his tenure, but can quickly list off items included in the mandate left him by Colonel Jim Irvine.

"There are binders of projects, inches thick of paperwork, and I had two weeks of face-to-face handover with Colonel Irvine. Without that, I'd be miles behind on issues. Now, we're already solving some."

The transition from Block II Aurora aircraft to the Block III (CP 140M) future continues, with new emphasis on long range patrol force restructuring. Huddleston wants the wing to look at its units, how they interact and sometimes duplicate efforts.

"How can we use people better? These won't be my ideas – it will be a collaborative solution."

Aviation maintenance and supply issues are always a challenge, with room for change and improvement everywhere from third line maintenance (contractor support), second line (currently done by 14 Air Maintenance Squadron) and first line (just recently added to the responsibilities of 405 (Long Range Patrol) Squadron.

"We have oversight from

the new renewal effort in the forces, and we'll be used as a pilot project for some of these new concepts. It's a chance to gain some required visibility, and get our ideas included."

Community connections outside base operations are also high on the priority list. Huddleston says his role is clear: ensure his military community has the supports it needs at home and at work, even while resources are stretched.

"We need to be smart and not overextend ourselves, but the importance of being part of the community here in the Valley also needs to be emphasized. People are used to the dynamics of a free and relaxed partnership between the base and its programs and the community, and lots off access – all positive things."

L'Escadre est sur la bonne voie

S'il y a un endroit où le colonel Iain Huddleston se sent chez lui, c'est fort probablement Greenwood.

Huddleston a pris le commandement de la base et de l'Escadre le 18 juillet et s'adapte à son nouveau rôle tout en retrouvant ses anciens quartiers : il y a passé sept ans au cours d'affectations antérieures.

« Je suis né en Allemagne. Comme mon père était militaire, j'ai vécu en Belgique, à Toronto, Ottawa, North Bay, St. Hubert, Cold Lake... », indique le colonel Huddleston. À 17 ans, il est entré au Collège militaire royal du Canada où il a commencé sa propre carrière militaire et sa propre vie mouvementée.

« Lorsqu'on me demande d'où je viens, je ne sais pas trop quoi répondre. Ma mère est originaire de Shelburne (ici en Nouvelle-Écosse), et mon père est écossais. Mes affectations les plus longues ont été à Greenwood. »

Il ne trouve pas que sa situation est « bizarre », même s'il peut énumérer les points négatifs et les points positifs de la vie militaire, comme les nombreux déménagements, les nouvelles expériences, les amis laissés derrière, l'éloignement

de la famille, et la connaissance d'autres cultures.

Toutefois, au moins pour les deux prochaines années, sa vie sera ici. Sa femme Amanda vit à Greenwood et ses parents vivent sur la rive-sud, ce qui est idéal pour leurs deux jeunes enfants.

En quelques semaines à peine, le colonel Huddleston a déjà un bon pressentiment à l'égard de Greenwood qu'il décrit comme un milieu plus positif que par le passé.

« Nous sommes maintenant reconnus à l'échelle nationale pour la qualité de nos unités de logement résidentiel, de nos programmes, de nos services et du soutien que nous offrons. Au cours des dernières années, nous avons aussi fait un grand pas en avant en matière de renseignements, de surveillance et de reconnaissance et avons eu une grande incidence sur la campagne de l'Arctique de la Force aérienne. Notre capacité de recherche et de sauvetage continue de répondre à l'appel, grâce à des professionnels hautement qualifiés. Nous sommes de plus en plus visibles, les nouvelles idées sont nombreuses et elles sont entendues. Voilà où nous en sommes actuellement. »

Le colonel Iain Huddleston entend poursuivre sur la même voie. Pour le moment, il n'a

pas encore établi d'objectifs personnels ou de buts qu'il aimerait atteindre dans le cadre de son mandat, mais il peut rapidement dresser la liste des éléments inclus dans le mandat que lui a laissé le colonel Jim Irvine.

« Il y a des cartables de projets, des documents de plusieurs pouces d'épaisseur, et j'ai eu deux semaines pour rencontrer le colonel Irvine afin d'effectuer le transfert. Sans cela, j'aurais été loin d'être au fait des enjeux, alors que maintenant, nous avons déjà pu résoudre certaines questions. »

La transition des Aurora phase II aux futurs Aurora phase III (CP 140M) se poursuit, et on se concentre maintenant sur la restructuration de la force de patrouille à long rayon d'action. Le colonel Huddleston veut que l'Escadre examine ses unités, comment elles interagissent et où il y a parfois des doublons d'efforts.

« Comment pouvons-nous utiliser plus efficacement le personnel? La solution ne viendra pas de moi mais bien de la collaboration de tous. »

Les questions liées à l'approvisionnement et à l'entretien des aéronefs représentent toujours un défi et il y a place pour le changement et l'amélioration partout,

qu'il s'agisse de l'entretien de troisième échelon (recours aux entrepreneurs), de deuxième échelon (actuellement effectué par le 14^e Escadron de maintenance (Air) et de premier échelon (récemment ajouté aux responsabilités du 405^e Escadron de patrouille à long rayon d'action).

« Nous devons superviser le nouvel effort de renouvellement au sein des forces et nous ferons partie d'un projet pilote pour certains de ces nouveaux concepts. Ce sera l'occasion d'accroître notre visibilité et de faire connaître nos idées. »

Les liens avec la communauté, en dehors des opérations de la base, occupent aussi un rang élevé dans la liste des priorités. Le colonel Huddleston indique que son rôle est clair et qu'il doit veiller à ce que les membres de son personnel puissent obtenir le soutien dont ils ont besoin, tant à la maison qu'au travail et même lorsque les ressources sont limitées.

« Nous devons agir intelligemment, sans aller au-delà de nos limites; il faut aussi accorder de l'importance au fait que nous faisons partie de la communauté, ici, dans la vallée. Les gens sont habitués à la dynamique décontractée qu'il y a entre la base, ses programmes et la communauté, tous des éléments positifs. »

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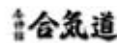
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Le délire dépensier autumnal

Il faut être calé en gestion des finances pour survivre à l'assaut des dépenses

d'automne. Ce qui est bien de la flambée des dépenses de septembre à décembre, c'est qu'elle est prévisible : la rentrée scolaire a toujours lieu en septembre, l'Action de grâces est toujours en octobre, et Noël est toujours

le 25 décembre. Heureusement, c'est beaucoup plus facile de planifier des activités lorsqu'elles sont certaines.

Mais comment peut-on faire pour non seulement survivre, mais également réussir? Mettez en application la formule suivante : examinez, réfléchissez, retravaillez.

Tout d'abord, examinez vos dépenses de l'année dernière à la même période en consultant vos reçus, bordereaux de retrait, relevés bancaires et factures de carte de crédit. Intra-base moves – Residential Housing Units

For the past two years, due to low availability of Residential Housing Units and funding restrictions for maintenance, HSC Greenwood was only accepting applications for intra-base moves when occupants met the requirements of the Licence to Occupy, such as a change in household size or for humanitarian reasons.

That said, this posting season we saw a change. More members were posted out of our RHUs than members posted in; therefore, we have a vacancy rate that is higher than expected.

Due to the increased availability of RHUs, HSC Greenwood will be accepting applications for intra-base moves from occupants who wish to relocate to another RHU. There are no restrictions on who may request a move and there is no guarantee your application will result in a permitted move.

Applications will be accepted at the HSC Greenwood office starting from 8 a.m. September 18 to October 18. Your name will be placed on a waiting list and each application will be evaluated separately. This is not a first come, first served basis; approval will be based upon need, availability of RHUs and maintenance funding to prepare the RHUs.

Fall spending frenzy

It takes savvy money management to survive the onslaught of fall expenses.
