Devil's Brigade: 'another day's work'

Greenwood veteran honoured with U.S. medal for wartime service

The heft of Ken Keddy's new medal recognizes the importance the United States Congress places on his Second World War service with the renowned 1st Special Service Force - the Devil's Brigade.

In 1943, at age 22, Keddy was working in and around Greenwood and Kingston on farms, cutting wood and in the apple factory. The second of six children raised on a Greenwood Square farm – now gone under the 14 Wing Greenwood air field, he put in long days.

Keddy sits quietly with his wife, Frances, in their Greenwood home but, for this visit, sports a medal-bedecked jacket and dress pants. His Congressional Gold Medal – an overlarge, double-sided U.S. Mint memento – is a weight in his hand, the highest civilian honour the U.S. Congress can award. It was formally presented in Washington DC February 6 to 14 Canadian members of the original joint American-Canadian brigade able to attend. From tough backgrounds, the men were trained for mountain and amphibious assaults and fought crucial battles in Italy and Southern France, taking key ground in heavily fortified areas. The unit became the model for the future Green Berets

“Ten hours a day, five cents an hour...,” Keddy says. With few radios and not paying too much attention to the news, Keddy wasn't very aware of Second World War events taking place so far from home.

“Then I heard what they were paying – and they gave you food and your uniform every day.” He signed on with the West Nova Scotia Regiment and, after training in Yarmouth and Aldershot, headed for England. From there, he travelled with the WNSR through North Africa and Italy.

“In Italy, we heard about the Special Forces,” he remembers. “They had been going a couple years,

Food safety trial underway at Annapolis Café

14 Wing Greenwood Food Services is taking part in a Canadian Armed Forces (CAF) national food safety trial, running through February and March.

The objectives are to see if ATP-B (adenosine triphosphate bioluminescence) rapid testing can be used by all CAF Food Services facilities; to get a clear picture of how clean CAF Food Service

facilities are; and, if the trial is successful, ATP-B Rapid Testing will become part of day-to-day practices.

Adenosine triphosphate (ATP) is the energy molecule found in all living things, making it a perfect indicator for figuring out if a surface is clean. ATP-B rapid testing measures how clean a surface is. The ATP found in food residues and living things is broken down by an enzyme to produce light

energy, then measured using a luminometer and giving the Relative Light Unit. The higher the number, the less clean the surface is. ATP-B rapid tests are a simple and quick way to evaluate cleaning and sanitizing in food service operations. All the testing requires is a quick swipe of a swab in the enzyme, and the luminometer does its magic.

Cooks and other team members at 14 Wing Greenwood Food Services are ex-

cited to take part in this modernization initiative, which will have positive benefits for safe food handling here at 14 Wing Greenwood, and across the country.

doing some of their training in Canada, the mountain climbing and skiing. They'd just lost a lot of men and were looking for recruits.

"I heard about the money."

Keddy joined the Special Forces and continued service through Italy.

"There were some islands we were landing on with rubber boats we filled up with air, and we'd go in at night from the big ship, paddling in. There was nothing, it was so dark."

When he thinks of the risk

involved in those landings, he's still astounded to consider the broad daylight assaults other troops made in D-Day landings in France.

He was injured once in Italy, as he and two others watched a street from behind a wrecked wooden structure.

"I was in the middle watching the front and a shell blew up and got all three of us. I reached down and pulled something out of my knee the size of my finger."

A couple weeks' recovery and he was back on the lines. He only ever shot one round: high up in a castle tower, he

saw a truck coming down a road. He knew it wasn't one of the Allies', so he shot the radiator out.

"I no sooner hit it than the driver's door flew open and he flew out of there into a nearby house."

Another time, the Germans were outside the brigade's fortifications before being moved off. Keddy knew the German officers had Luger revolvers, and he thought he'd go see if he could find one.

"A fellow was lying there in a little dip, level with the ground – sound asleep. He woke up and reached for his

gun, but he had nothing there with him. I took him prisoner."

The brigade travelled up through Belgium and Holland, and Keddy, to this day, wonders why anyone would do what he saw done to another human being, even children.

"I remember when I was a kid, maybe four or five years old, growing up with my grandparents. My grandmother took me to church every Sunday, and I think that's what kept me during the war. God was watching out."

At the end of the war, ranked as a private, he returned to the Canadian Army and was back

home in Greenwood in 1945 or 1946 – he "never paid too much attention to dates and times." He married, had children and worked at this and that for decades. He's never been back to Europe, and hasn't had much contact with wartime peers or comrades from the Devil's Brigade.

"It was no different then the West Novas: they were looking for something, they'd tell you what to do and we did it. It was another day's work, nothing different than working home on the farm. That was a good attitude, I think so."

Auroras fly 100th OP Impact mission

Long Range Patrol Detachment, Air Task Force – Iraq

As the sun sank into the dusty desert of Kuwait over

Camp Canada, turning the sand a deep orange hue, the throb of four Allison turbo-prop engines announced the safe return to base of the 100th intelligence, surveil-

lance and reconnaissance (ISR) mission by a CP140 Aurora aircrew over Iraq.

Members of Air Task Force-Iraq's CP140 Long Range Patrol (LRP) Detachment have

been engaged in the fight against the Islamic State of Iraq and the Levant (ISIL) since late October 2014, amassing nearly 900 hours of flying during 100 missions and gathering considerable information and imagery on ISIL activities.

The 100th mission marks an across-the-board success for the Aurora community. Operation Impact, the Canadian Armed Forces' mission against ISIL, has seen the solidification of new capabilities for the Aurora fleet, building on operations in Libya and Afghanistan with the use of the upgraded Block III CP140.

The modernized Block III Aurora aircraft is well equipped to fulfil a number of roles, both over water in its traditional maritime patrol capacity, as well as over the desert, where the capabilities of aircraft and crew have received much acclaim throughout the coalition. The improved Aurora is equipped

with new sensors, like the Wescam MX20 camera and Ground Mapping Radar. The MX20 can image points of interest with high definition resolution during the day and night, due to its heat-sensitive infrared camera. Thanks to developments in radar technology, even on days of total cloud cover, the Aurora can see through it, taking images of ground sites that rival anything a conventional camera can produce. This imagery can be sent immediately to analysts who identify and assess objects that merit further investigation or potential airstrikes.

The benefit of having ISR missions performed by a manned platform, instead of a remotely piloted vehicle, is the human component on board. Crewmembers that are immersed in the mission and have situational awareness over the battle space are often better able to differentiate that which is out of the ordinary from the normal pattern of

life on the ground.

Despite living and working in a sandy environment, constantly battling the heat and frequent dust storms, the dedicated Aurora aircraft technicians have given their utmost to ensure superb serviceability of the aircraft in theatre. The 100 mission milestone was only achieved thanks to round-the-clock efforts of all the technicians, aircrews and support staff that have been part of this detachment.

As the aircraft landed from this 100th sortie, the LRP detachment gathered together to celebrate with pizza and pop. However, the celebrations couldn't last too long into the night; there was one aircraft to put to bed, another to wake up and make ready, and the next crew needed to rest prior to their 101st long mission. Through a team effort, the LRP detachment of Air Task Force-Iraq will continue to help ensure ISIL has no place to hide.

Coalition efforts continue in Iraq

March 5, Captain (Navy) Paul Forget, Canadian Joint Operations Command, gave the latest technical briefing on Operation Impact activity. Op Impact is the Canadian Armed Forces' support to the coalition fight against the Islamic State of Iraq and Levant (ISIL) in Iraq.

February 18 and 19, the Chief of the Defence Staff, General Tom Lawson, participated in a two-day meeting in Saudi Arabia, where he and representatives from over 25 countries in the coalition assessed the progress of the coalition, and discussed future operations to deter and, ultimately, defeat ISIL.

Of note, in the last four months, ISIL has suffered the loss of several senior leaders due to coalition airstrikes and several reports indicate fighters are deserting their ranks. ISIL has focused recruiting

efforts internationally, and is coercing the Iraqi population to replenish increasing battlefield losses. Radicalized youth from Western nations are recruited and used as suicide bombers, or sent into battle without experience.

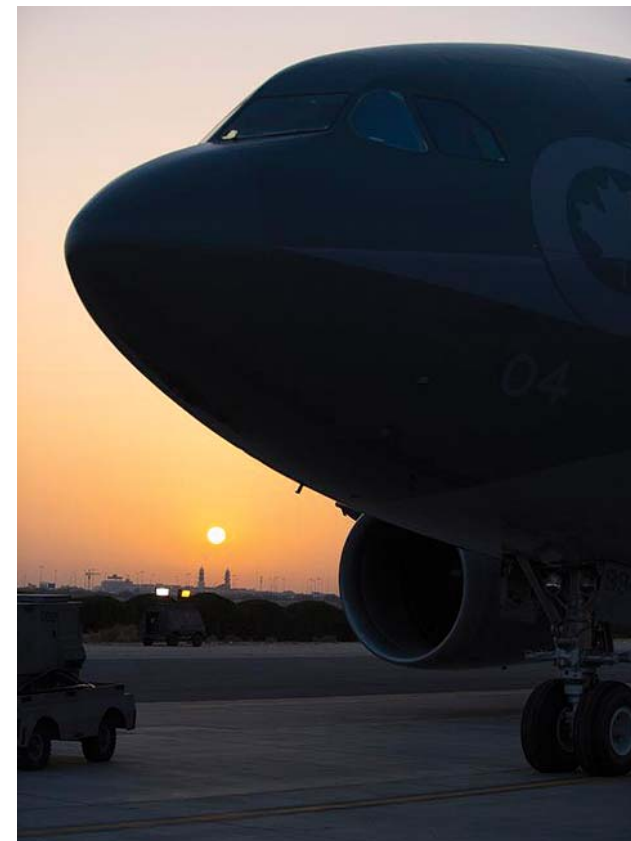
In Northern Iraq, Iraqi forces, aided by coalition airpower, continue to conduct offensive operations and planning with a view to expanding their control of territory around the ISIL stronghold of Mosul. In the Euphrates River Valley, successful Iraqi forces' clearance operations have improved the security situation for coalition and Iraqi forces in that region. In Central Iraq, Iraqi forces led independent offensive operations against ISIL in the vicinity of Tikrit, while securing critical infrastructure and lines of communication in the vicinity of Baiji.

It is expected the presence and activities of Canadian CF18 fighters, as well as coalition aircraft in theatre, have a dissuasive effect on ISIL. Since commencing operations, the coalition has conducted approximately 1,500 airstrikes in Iraq, targeting mortar and fighting positions, bunkers, heavy machine guns, checkpoints and buildings used by ISIL. CF18s have conducted 372 sorties to date. February 24, CF18s struck three ISIL fighting positions north of Mosul. In addition, the CC150 Polaris have conducted 94 sorties, and the CP140 Aurora have completed 104 sorties, bringing the total number of sorties flown by Canadian aircraft since the beginning of Operations Impact to 570 sorties.

The Aurora recently completed 100 missions, gathering extensive imagery and

information on ISIL activities, which aids coalition efforts on the ground. Our crews work long, dedicated hours to collect imagery, as well as to ensure the Aurora are ready to fly in the hot, dusty conditions of the region.

The Aurora has been part of the RCAF fleet for over 30 years, and it has undergone equipment modernization which allows it to maintain a state-of-the-art capability for performing intelligence, surveillance and reconnaissance missions. While deployed on Operation Impact, the Aurora and its crew have received much acclaim from the coalition, providing situational awareness over the battle space, collecting imagery to be used in identifying and assessing targets, conducting battle damage assessments and minimizing collateral damage

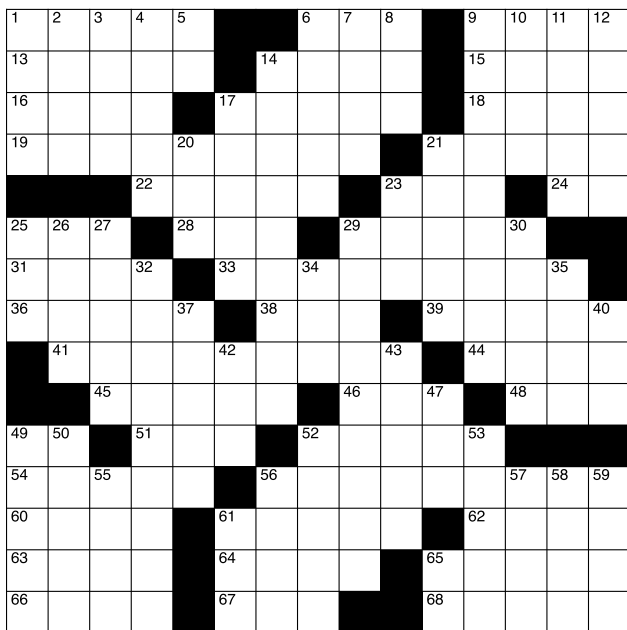
