Op Impact pressure on ISIL continues

Captain (Navy) Paul Forget, Canadian Joint Operations Command, provided a technical briefing March 20 on coalition efforts in support of Iraq security forces, and effects on Islamic State of Iraq and Levant operations. ISIL's initial rapid gains throughout Iraq are being reversed, its advance has been halted throughout Iraq and it no longer has the ability to operate freely in roughly 20 to 25 per cent of populated areas where they once held the initiative.

In Northern Iraq, Iraqi forces are gradually taking back ground east of Mosul where ISIL is in a defensive posture. In Central Iraq, north and northwest of Baghdad, the coalition has been conducting strikes against fixed and moving targets in ISIL-controlled and ISIL-contested areas. In Western Iraq, the city of al-Baghdadi has been reclaimed by Iraqi forces, and they are

working toward regaining control of Fallujah.

There is more work to be done. Coalition members should be prepared for some setbacks, as ISIL could attempt to launch attacks in the near future. However, they are unlikely to reverse the gains made by the Iraqi forces.

As of March 21, Canada's effort, through Operation Impact, to support Iraqi forces has consisted of 53

air strikes, and 428 CF18 fighter sorties. March 19, CF18 Hornets successfully struck an ISIL IED factory west of Kirkuk by using precision guided munitions. During another strike March 20, CF18 Hornets successfully struck ISIL equipment and fighting positions northeast of Mosul.

The Polaris air-to-air refueller has delivered more than six million pounds of fuel to coalition aircraft in

108 sorties.

Aurora aircraft have conducted 120 intelligence reconnaissance and surveillance missions to assist in targeting and planning of future operations. The Aurora also conducted battle damage assessments to confirm the effectiveness of coalition air strikes.

Canadian Armed Forces personnel are fully integrated in the coalition headquarters, adding Canadian military planning expertise in the fight against ISIL. Canadian Special Operations Forces provide advice and assistance to Iraqi forces to help them develop their military capabilities.

"We can be proud of the professionalism that has been displayed by the Canadian Armed Forces members that have been deployed since August of last year," Forget said.

New museum library opens books, history to readers

With a few book shelves and some sweat equity lugging books from place to place, the Greenwood Military Aviation Museum has created a reading room that could be the envy of military museums across the country.

"We thought we'd like to have a proper resource centre, and this has been really nice to get this done," says 14 Wing Greenwood's Wing Heritage Officer Major Bob Johnson.

In what was "just" a room used as a boardroom and classroom space for the museum's Grade 6 Flight Education program, the museum now boasts a comprehensive

library, with 75 per cent of previously scattered holdings now in place on the shelves. Purchased and donated reading material over the years had been held by the museum, but was not really fully accessible.

"We do get people in looking for specific material, and it was difficult to provide them a space to look at it," says Johnson.

Museum volunteer Ron Hill has spent much time organizing the collection for the move, including putting a classic Dewey Decimal system in place; and volunteer Jessie Corbett is also coming on board.

Now, the collection is displayed on open bookshelves, with pieces from the mu-

seum's military aviation art collection hung on the walls and scale models of 14 Wing Greenwood-affiliated aircraft, past and present, set on the highest shelves. The broad boardroom table is now the perfect place to spread out a collection of material for study.

"We'll be the envy of a lot of museums, and this is all here now for general consumption," Johnson says.

The museum's library will be open during regular museum hours. The collection includes reference, historical, technical and biographic material; DVDs and a set of National Film Board programs specific to Greenwood; all material is non-circulating.

New coin commemorates Canadians in Battle of Britain

In mid-1940, Nazi Germany launched an aerial campaign to soften Great Britain in preparation for invasion. The Luftwaffe had no idea just how hard that campaign would become.

More than 100 Canadians were among the aviators who arrived in southern England from Commonwealth nations around the world. From July to October, 23 Canadians

were killed in the first battle ever waged entirely in the air. The Battle of Britain not only put an end to the Nazi intent to invade Great Britain, but inspired Allied Forces throughout the war and thereafter.

The Royal Canadian Mint has launched its Second World War Battlefront Series of coins with a silver coin commemorating the role Canadian aviators played in

the Battle of Britain.

The coin depicts a dogfight in the sky above England's southeastern coast. A Canadian pilot ascends in his Hawker Hurricane fighter aircraft after leaving a Luftwaffe Dornier Do 17Z with dark smoke billowing from one

of its engines. Far below, the English Channel meets the White Cliffs of Dover.

The Second World War Battlefront Series of coins will depict scenes from key battles in which Canadians participated during the Second World War.

# Le Mois des enfants de militaires souligne leur courage, leur force et les défis qu'ils ont à relever

Amanda Huddleston se revoit, petite fille, guettant à la fenêtre de sa nouvelle maison, dans une nouvelle ville, le passage d'enfants paraissant à peu près de son âge. Le moment venu, elle sortait en courant, enfourchait son vélo et partait à leur poursuite, pour se faire de nouveaux amis.

« Les enfants de militaires doivent avoir le courage de franchir le pas », explique-t-elle. C'est ce qui la motive pour être le chef de file, à la 14e Escadre Greenwood, de l'initiative qui vise à rendre hommage aux enfants, à les soutenir et à faire savoir ce qu'ils vivent, pendant tout le mois d'avril désigné Mois des enfants de militaires.

C'est la deuxième année que la base participera à cette campagne, qui a vu le jour aux États-Unis dans les années 1980. Mme Huddleston en a entendu parler pour la première fois lorsque sa famille était basée à Trenton. Elle a alors pensé à lancer la campagne, mais c'est en 2013, à son arrivée à Greenwood avec ses deux enfants et son mari, le colonel Iain Huddleston, commandant de l'escadre, qu'elle a mis son projet à exécution.

« L'année dernière, la campagne a été discrète... Nous sommes allés dans quatre écoles de la région distribuer des pissenlits faits à la main (le pissenlit a été choisi comme symbole de la campagne en raison de sa grande capacité d'adaptation) et des cartes avec un poème thématique. Chaque école est parrainée par un escadron de la 14e Escadre. Des militaires et l'agent des relations avec les écoles du Centre de ressources pour les familles des militaires ont donc fait la tournée des écoles, où ils ont été très bien accueillis », explique Mme Huddleston.

Une autre mère lui a dit que son fils était rentré de l'école ce jour-là avec sa carte et qu'il lui a lu le poème.

« Il était fier et tout excité et se sentait vraiment concerné – la campagne a eu un effet bien plus grand que je l'espérais », a-t-elle expliqué.

Cette année, Mme Huddleston collabore étroitement avec le CRFM et les Affaires publiques de l'Escadre pour le déroulement de la campagne. Les services d'imagerie de

l'Escadre ont créé une vidéo où Mme Huddleston apparaît avec des enfants, qui racontent les expériences qu'ils ont vécues en tant qu'enfants de militaires. Selon eux, les principaux avantages liés à la vie dans une famille militaire sont les occasions de se faire de nombreux amis, d'apprendre une nouvelle langue, de découvrir différentes cultures et différents lieux. Quand leur mère ou leur père est absent en raison de son travail, les enfants disent qu'ils prennent soin des animaux de la famille ou qu'ils aident à faire la vaisselle, qu'ils font du sport et qu'ils participent à des activités extrascolaires, enfin, ils s'occupent de toutes les façons possibles.

« C'est pour cela qu'il faut accorder de l'attention aux enfants. Bon nombre d'entre eux ne comprennent même pas ce qu'ils ressentent et ne savent pas que d'autres enfants ou d'autres

membres de la famille ressentent la même chose qu'eux... Finalement, ils deviennent de jeunes adultes bien intégrés et indépendants », dit Mme Huddleston.

Avec le cycle actuel de déploiements exigeants en cours à la 14e Escadre Greenwood, des familles vivent pleinement l'expérience militaire en ce moment : les relations à distance, l'absence à Noël, les enfants qui peuvent se comporter différemment à l'école ou les parents « célibataires » qui se sentent au bout du rouleau. Mme Huddleston est consciente que la vie des militaires a des répercussions sur les familles, sur les écoles et sur les communautés.

L'initiative a été étendue cette année à l'école West Kings (en plus des écoles Dwight Ross, Rose des vents, Pine Ridge et Kingston). Les équipes de ces écoles ont déjà été renseignées sur les projets spéciaux. Un bouleau sera placé dans l'entrée de chaque école et des cartes décorées avec des pissenlits seront distribuées aux élèves qui y raconteront leurs expériences d'enfants de militaires et les placeront sur l'arbre. La vidéo sera projetée aux assemblées, et des conférenciers de la base seront présents pour échanger avec les élèves. Des livres éducatifs seront donnés aux bibliothèques des écoles et chacun repartira à la maison avec un signet souvenir.

« Nous avons quelques suggestions pour les écoles, mais nous souhaitons vraiment laisser libre cours à la créativité des enfants. »

Sa famille sera réaffectée l'été prochain, mais Mme Huddleston espère bien que cette deuxième campagne ancrera la tradition du Mois des enfants de militaires à Greenwood avant son départ. La prochaine étape pourrait voir la participation de partenaires provinciaux et nationaux, et la montée en puissance de la campagne.

« Une des personnes qui apparaissent dans la vidéo est un militaire qui explique qu'on entend toujours parler de la joie et de l'excitation que tous ressentent au moment du départ en mission. Mais il raconte également que les militaires en mission pensent à leur famille tous les jours pendant leur absence. C'est très émouvant » explique Mme Huddleston.



## Military kids' month marks courage, strength, challenges

Amanda Huddleston remembers, as a girl, sitting in the front window of her house in a new community, watching for kids that looked to be her own age to pass by. She'd run out, jump on her bike and "chase after them" to find a new friend.

"Military children have to have the courage to 'get out there,'" she says, and that's the reason recognition, support and awareness through April, the Month of the Military Child, is something she's guiding here at 14 Wing Greenwood.

This will be the second year the base has adopted the American military campaign, first launched in the 1980s. Huddleston first heard of it when her family was posted in Trenton: she was interested in getting it started there but, upon arrival in Greenwood in 2013 with spouse, Wing Commander Colonel Iain Huddleston, and their two children; she decided to actively pursue it.

"Last year was low-key," she says. "We went into four local schools and handed out handmade dandelions (the campaign's adopted symbol, a flower known for its resiliency) and cards with a themed poem. Each school has a sponsoring squadron from 14 Wing, so members and the Military Family Resource Centre's school liaison officer went in and spoke. The schools were very

welcoming, and it was very well received."

Another mother told her her son came home with his card, reading the poem to her that evening.

"He was proud and excited and really felt a connection – it's had a far larger effect than I expected it to."

This year, Huddleston is working closely with the MFRC and Wing Public Affairs to nurture the campaign. A video has been created by Wing Imaging, interviewing Huddleston and a handful of children, on their experiences in a military family. The children were asked about the bigger opportunities of being a military child, citing lots of new friends, learning a new language, and being exposed to different cultures and places. When mom or dad is away because of work, the kids say they help with pets or dishes, take on sports and extracurricular activities – anything to keep busy.

"Kids need attention on them for this – a lot of them won't even understand what they're feeling, or that other kids or family members feel the same way," says Huddleston. "In the long run, you do see well-adjusted, independent young adults."

With a cycle of demanding deployments underway at 14 Wing Greenwood, there are local families living the full military experience right now: long-distance contact, Christmas without a loved one, children who might act differently at school or "single"

parents feeling a bit frazzled. Huddleston is aware of a noticeable impact on families, schools and communities where military life comes into play.

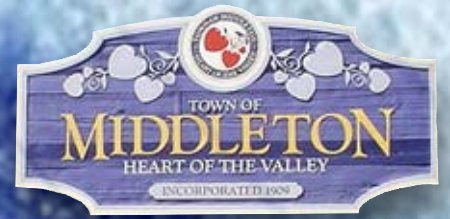
Expanding to include West Kings this April (plus Dwight Ross, École rose des vents, Pine Ridge and Kingston), each school's staff have already been briefed on special projects. A birch tree will be placed in each lobby, and dandelion decorated cards will be given to students to write their experiences as a military child on, and then place on the tree. The video will be shown at assemblies, with base guests on hand to host a discussion with students. A few resource books will be given to school libraries, and everyone will go home with a special bookmark memento.

"We have some suggestions for schools, but we're really hoping to let the kids' creativity come through."

Huddleston's family will be posted this coming summer, and she's hoping this second celebration of the Month of the Military Child will take root in Greenwood before she goes. Provincial and national partners – and growth – could be the next phase.

"One of the people in the video is a military member, and he's talking about how you always hear how happy and excited they are to go off and do their jobs – but he also says they think about their families every day they're away. That's really moving."

## Middleton heart drives Hockeyville campaign

If all went according to an entire town's hopes – and hard work – Saturday night, Middleton is in the running for Kraft Hockeyville 2015 right now.

"When – not if – we make the top two," says local Hockeyville campaign volunteer Maryanne Wagstaff, "we'll be back at the rink from first thing Sunday – hoping for more people, more food and more support!"

Middleton turned out through the top 10 voting

period March 21 to 23. The final top two teams were announced March 28 on Hockey Night in Canada. Whatever happens, Wagstaff is "amazed" with what Middleton has done in the past couple of months.

"We have 1,700 people in town, and then there's our wider community – but we've been going up against communities with 150,000 people. Their hockey program would be more than our population!"



What makes the difference is that sense of community in a small place like Middleton, Wagstaff says.

"Here, everyone knows everyone, everyone supports each other and cares about each other and wants the best for each other.

As voting through the top 10 period was underway last week, it was obvious in the community and through social media Middleton was hoping for Hockeyville success.

"The three voting days? Oh my gosh – they were so busy!



It was way past my bed time!" Wagstaff says. "People were so supportive, they sent way more food than we could have eaten at the rink voting get-together. Everyone wanted to do their part, and it was amazing."

As voting drew to a close at 12:30 a.m. March 24, Wagstaff asked on the campaign's Facebook site who was still voting, thinking it was so late, and so much effort had been put into the three days just passed.

"Facebook just blew up: 'I'm here,' 'I'm still here!'"

Nothing formal was planned for Middleton March 28, as Hockey Night in Canada was making its top two announcement, but Wagstaff says she and hundreds of other local Hockeyville hopefuls were glued to their TVs and social media. If the announcement was good news, the goal was to be back at the Middleton rink first thing March 29 for the final voting push.

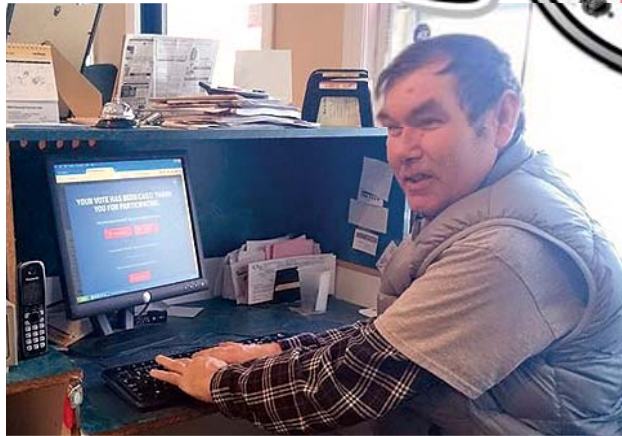

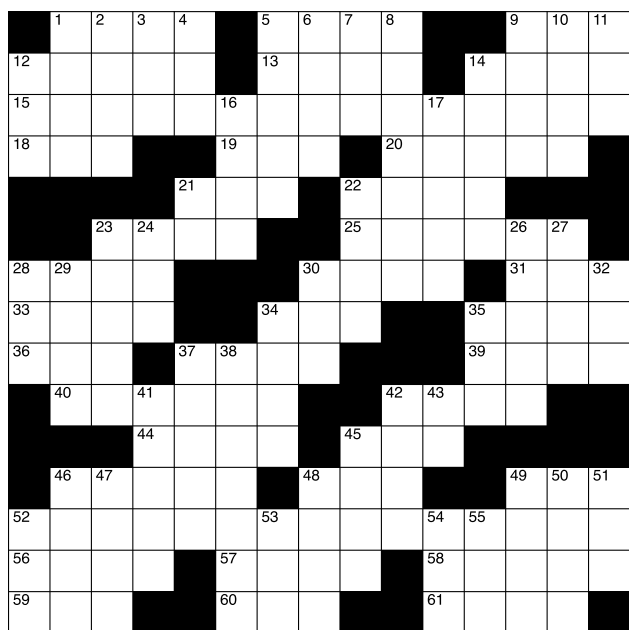

The Apple Tree Foundation presents its 2nd annual 5 km run/walk challenge April 26, in support of the Kings Regional Rehabilitation Centre.

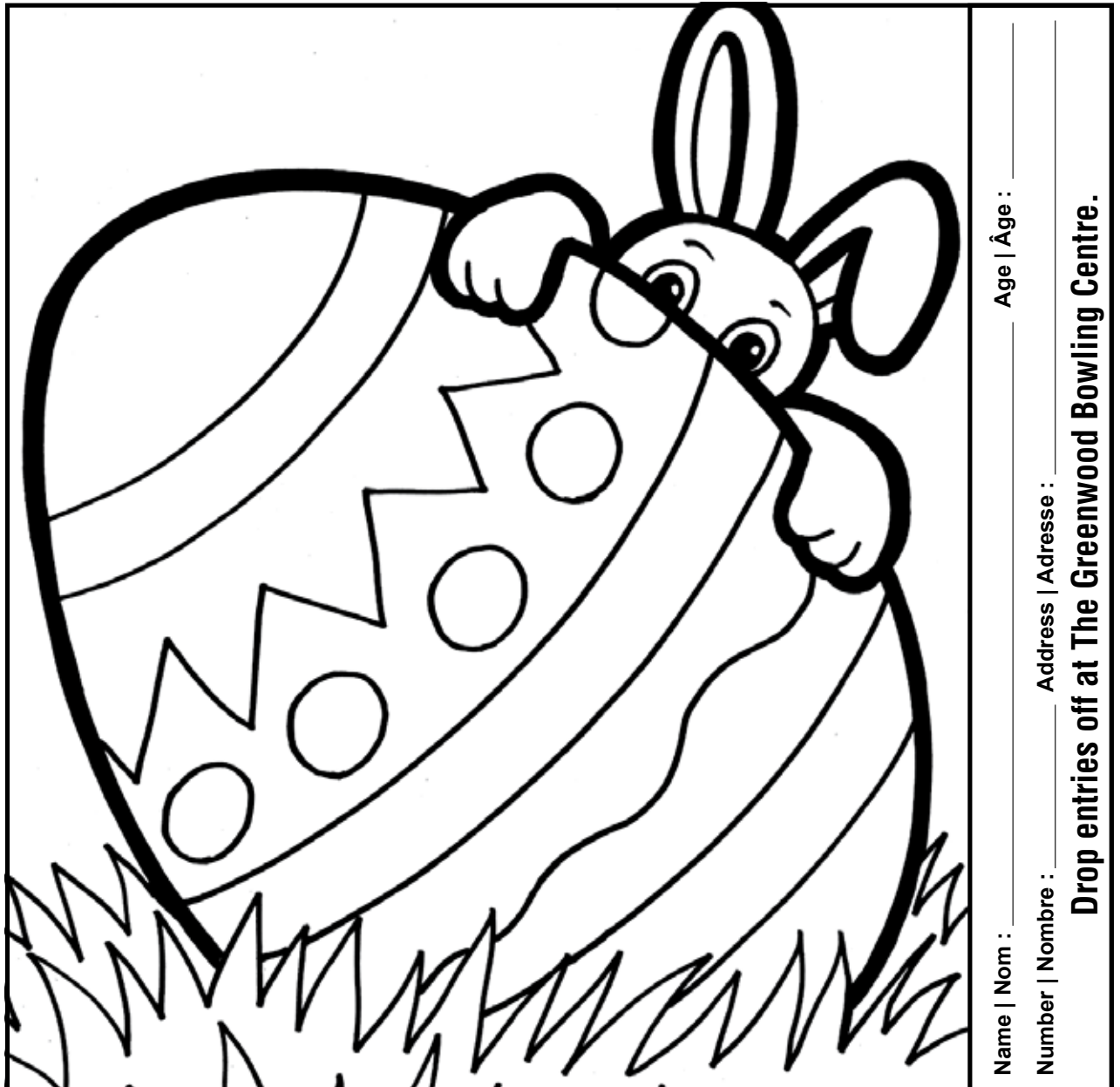
