Precision probe checks in on underground issues



The heavy duty drill rig is pretty traditional, but the laser induced fluorescence technology at the tip of the drill is state-of-the-art. Testing of a long-standing monitored site at 14 Wing Greenwood in March provided some valuable data on residual hydrocarbon contamination from a fuel tank, removed from the Kingswood Road site in the 1990s.

Almost 20 years of monitoring a 14 Wing Greenwood lot came a lot closer to resolution in March.

A drill pushing a laser induced fluorescence device 20 feet into the ground off Kingswood Road provided the most extensive picture of residual hydrocarbons left from an underground fuel tank, removed in the 1990s, from the approximate one acre site around Building 125.

Steve Sauveur, wing environmental officer, says the land has been part of the base's monitoring program since the tank removal, and it was hoped in 2012, after two years of consecutive clear results, the site could be declared clean. The third test that year didn't give the base the answers it was hoping for.

"The nice thing about this laser technology is we see the results as they push the probe, and we can decide where to push the probe next. It's relatively inexpensive, compared to a well."

Traditional monitoring means taking groundwater samples from a series of eight wells set in the 1990s. But, there's no way of knowing where the groundwater in the sample comes from underground, and the sample is confined to the original wells.

Michael Campbell and his business, SCG Industries Limited, is based in New Brunswick. The tip of the drill has a "window," where the laser is beamed out into the surrounding soil and received back. Fibre optic cables through the drill shaft back to a laptop on the surface means a picture of what's in the immediate soil around the bit can be seen "at the speed of light."

"The laser sees the contaminant, it fluoresces and now you know – not what the levels are, but where to take a soil sample," Campbell says. He estimated his rig would push down a couple dozen probes March 24 and 25.

"This site has been here like this over 10 years, the base has had five different consultants in and taken samples several times a year – those were the best tools at the time, but the tools have changed. If you were going to excavate - imagine the guessing, the costs of treatment, the sampling.... We can now go in and see the exact areas of impact."

Sauveur had hoped the laser sampling and subsequent monitoring might mean an all-clear for the site by 2016 but, with the newest SCG report, it likely won't happen.

"There was nothing alarming, but we will have to put the information into the base's monitoring program and look at our priorities."

Michael Campbell wasn't too far from home on this drill site, even though his company now works in the Arctic, Texas, Newfoundland – all over the world.

"My dad was an airframe technician, and we lived in Frontenac for a few years while he was here," he says.

When he was six, Campbell was only allowed to ride his bicycle in the lodge's front yard.

"All the other boys could go up Lodge Road to the 'hill' – the slight incline from the roadway to the water pump house lot.

"When Mom wasn't looking one day, I decided I was going for it! I rode off and got halfway up the hill. I lost my momentum and tried to turn and lost it altogether. There's a bit of my DNA in this dirt!"

Op Impact extension to 2016 before government

Prime Minister Stephen Harper March 24 announced the government's intent to bring forward a motion in the House of Commons seeking support to extend and expand Canada's military contribution to the global fight against

the Islamic State of Iraq and Levant (ISIL).

The Canadian military mission, known as Operation Impact, is part of the United States-led international coalition against ISIL, composed of over 60 countries. Canada's

current military contribution against ISIL includes up to 69 Canadian Special Operations Forces personnel to advise and assist Iraqi forces in Northern Iraq, approximately 280 aircrew and other personnel, one CC150 Polaris

aerial refueling aircraft, up to two CP140 Aurora aerial surveillance aircraft, and a strike force package consisting of approximately 320 aircrew and other personnel, and up to six CF188 Hornet fighter aircraft.

As of March 28, RCAF com-

ponents of Air Task Force-Iraq had conducted 693 sorties, including 452 sorties by CF188 Hornet fighters, 115 sorties by the CC150T Polaris aerial refueller, delivering some 6,737,000 pounds of fuel to coalition aircraft; and 126 reconnaissance missions by CP140 Aurora aircraft.

Operation Impact would be extended for up to 12 months, until March 30, 2016. Its mandate would be expanded to authorize Canada's CF188 Hornet fighters to join coalition partners in attacking ISIL targets within Syrian territory. Canada will not be participating in ground combat operations.

Coalition military efforts to date have succeeded in blunting ISIL's capacity to advance in Iraq and Syria. Canada also remains committed to protecting and assisting vulnerable and innocent civilians affected by ISIL's expansion, including through the provision of humanitarian assistance.

"I believe that Canadians realize that we cannot stand on the sidelines while ISIL commits atrocities in the Middle East and promotes terrorism in Canada and against our allies," said Harper. "We are therefore seeking the support of Canadian parliamentarians

for our decision to extend and expand Canada's military mission, with our allies, to fight Islamic jihadism which threatens national and global security. We intend to continue to degrade and disrupt ISIL as well as provide humanitarian and stabilization support to help alleviate the suffering this terrorist group is inflicting."

"On behalf of all Canadians, I would like to offer my profound gratitude and unequivocal support to all members of the Canadian Armed Forces engaged in Operation Impact. We are humbled and eternally grateful for your service and sacrifice."

Day of Honour coverage recognized nationally

The Aurora Newspaper won second place recognition in a national newspaper competition, when winners of the Newspapers Canada 2015 Canadian Community Newspaper Awards were announced March 27.

Managing editor Sara Keddy's National Day of Honour coverage in the May 5, 2014 Aurora Newspaper included five pages of colour images and a dozen personal stories from 14 Wing Greenwood military and civilian personnel who deployed over the 10-year-plus Afghanistan mission. The May 9 National Day of Honour itself marked the end of Canada's military role in Afghanistan.

"Personnel at 14 Wing Greenwood were an integral part of this mission, in a myriad of military and civilian roles," Keddy explained in the entry's cover letter for judges. "The Aurora undertook to mark this national commemoration with a look of some of our own people's stories, from all ranks, and their experiences cover deployments to Afghanistan

from the beginning of the mission to the end, including camp, transport and airfield operations; to medical work to legal and communications advisory roles. The feature captured how participating members felt their individual contributions may have made a difference during their deployment and, perhaps, in the longer term sustainability of such a challenged country.

"All were asked about hopes for Afghanistan, and all responded with expectations things *could* be better – but personal experience, and the 10-year-plus Canadian and international experience in Afghanistan, demonstrate daunting obstacles for the future."

This is the first major project undertaken by The Aurora Newspaper to reflect such a comprehensive experience by so many 14 Wing personnel over such a long period of time. Aurora production coordinator Brian Graves led design of the coverage, which also included contributed images from Wing Imaging's Sergeant Ken Fenner, taken



during his own Afghanistan deployment.

"The National Day of Honour initiative... is a significant historical collection of 14 Wing personnel's experiences in a national and international mission," Keddy said. "It took a month of planning, interviewing, writing and design to cover the mission the way we felt marked

our personnel's mark on the Afghanistan mission."

CCNA judges placed The Aurora's entry second in Class 2051 - Outstanding Reporter Initiative – Circulation Up to 9999, behind a Nunavut News/ North submission, "Best to let dump burn," by Casey Lessard. The Rocky Mountain Outlook's entry, "New Parks policy limits

information," by Cathy Ellis, rounded out the top three.

The Lookout, the Canadian Forces Newspaper serving CFB Esquimaux, won Class

2311 – Best Canadian Forces Base Newspaper – Circulation Open; followed by the Journal Adsum, CFB Valcartier, in second; and The Trident Newspaper, serving CFB Halifax - Maritime Forces Atlantic, in third. The Lookout also won Class 2132 - Best Feature Photo- Circulation 4000 to 12499, with an image by Corporal Michael Bastien.

The Canadian Community Newspaper Awards feature over 30 unique categories honouring outstanding editorial, photography, multimedia and overall excellence in community newspaper publishing. The 2015 competition saw 264 publications from coast to coast submit over 2,700 entries representing their best work from 2014.

## Helping your child transition to a new school

How can I best prepare my child for school in a new country? Will my child meet the credit requirements for graduation this year? Are there any educational allowances to support my child with special needs?

Children's Education Management, managed

by Military Family Services under Canadian Forces Morale and Welfare Services, has been managing the educational needs of children of Canadian Armed Forces families since 1947. The introduction of guidance counselling services, though, is a new initiative

to further support the education of children as they move from province to province, or out of country. A guidance counsellor and a distance learning coordinator are now on hand to help children transition from one school year to the next, or from one posting

to the next. The guidance counsellor can assist with the interpretation of one curriculum versus another and explain credit requirements, deficiencies and equivalents. The guidance counsellor can also recommend distance learning courses as a solution in meeting academic requirements and then a distance learning coordinator can provide oversight and assistance.

Children's Education Management programs and services are designed to mitigate potential nega-

tive impacts on schooling due to geographical moves. If preparing for a posting out-of-province or out-of-country, assistance in understanding which credits are required and which are transferable is now available and accessible to all military families.

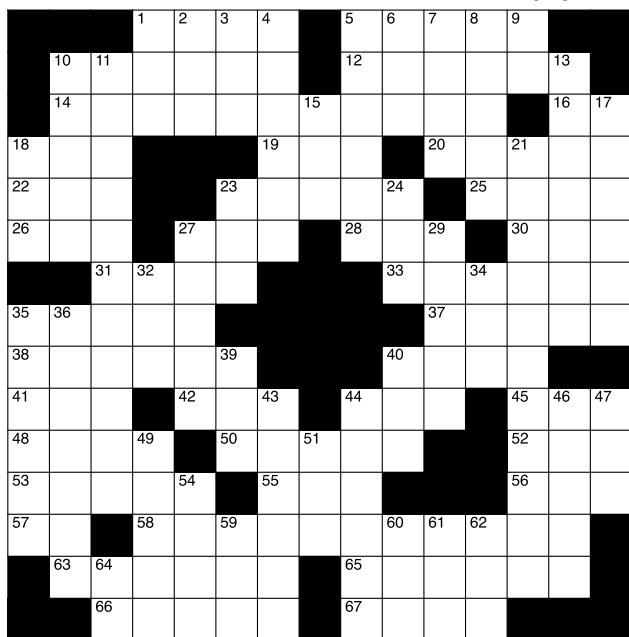

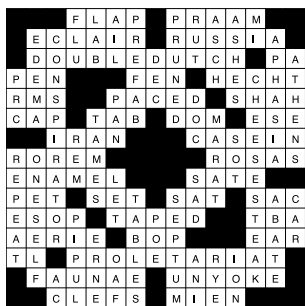

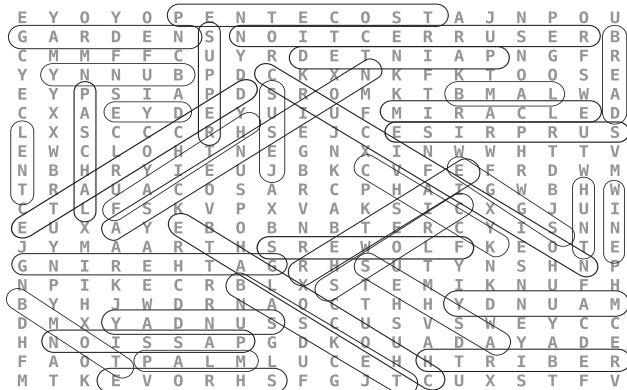
