## Pathfinder heritage explored

### Modern day 405 Squadron members explore their 'home'

13 to 16 with their crew from 14 Wing Greenwood's 405 (Long Range Patrol) Squadron, showing off the RCAF's CP140 Aurora aircraft. July 19, though, Parsons and MacGregor followed in the footsteps of thousands before them, visiting RAF Wyton, the official home of the Second World War Pathfinder squadrons.

While the Royal International Air Tattoo at Royal Air Force Fairford in Gloucestershire, England, attracted 170,000 visitors over three days in July to see 245 display aircraft from 25 countries, two men took time to explore the heritage and home of their Royal Canadian Air Force squadron.

Chief Warrant Officer Dean Parsons and Major Dan MacGregor attended RIAT July

"We are the only non-British Pathfinder squadron" of Pathfinders, said Parsons.

Earlier in June, before the RIAT air show was on 405 Squadron's calendar, Parsons

## Air show advice as wing, community preps for busy weekend

Expect all eyes on the skies August 31 and September 1, as the 2019 Atlantic International Air Show returns to 14 Wing Greenwood.

Over 12,000 people attend the 2017 event; and good

weather and a solid line-up of aviation static and fling displays will see return crowds making their way to the event.

Gates to the air show grounds will open to the public at 10 a.m. both days,

with the air show flying displays expected to be underway at noon. Flying displays will wrap up around 4 p.m. daily, with the gates closed at 5 p.m.

Military Police, RCMP and

contracted private security will be setting up traffic control points at several major intersections approaching 14 Wing Greenwood, but visitors are asked to use caution, be patient and adhere to the

direction given. Parking in unauthorized areas will result in towing, and people are reminded to secure vehicles and either leave valuables at home or stow them out of sight.

had heard from RCAF Captain Brandon McCool, posted to RAF Wyton, with regard to a "lack" of Canadian squadron items and memorabilia at RAF Wyton's heritage centre.

"We had discussed getting some items to send over for display... and with the Royal International Air Tattoo coming up... I thought I could combine the two events."

Parsons and MacGregor drove two hours from RAF Fairford to RAF Wyton and met up with Warrant Officer Simon Hopkins, Sergeant Chris McCormick from RAF Wyton's heritage centre and Officer's Mess vice-president Lieutenant Commander Bradley. They presented wooden 405 Squadron crests to both the Officers Mess and the Warrant Officers and Sergeants Mess, and had the opportunity to talk about the evolution of the base from its years as a Second World War air station to current operations-based roles.

"And we had a great fish 'n chips with mushy peas!" Parsons said. "The major also discovered he does not have a taste for shandy."

They spent the afternoon in

the heritage centre, including a great tour by McCormick, assisted by a few RAF veterans who had worked on the station and on the Nimrod aircraft and simulators.

"The tour highlight was the Pathfinder Room, in which there were many artifacts of the Second World War Pathfinder squadrons, including our very own 405 Squadron!"

Parsons and MacGregor presented the station with a large 405 Squadron herald and two posters with information about squadron heritage and the heraldic badge. In return, RAF Wyton presented the men with gifts to return with to 14 Wing Greenwood, including an RAF Wyton crest, a gift from the Warrant Officers and Sergeants Mess; a Joint Forces Command crest and a framed photo of the Pathfinders, gifts from RAF Wyton.

After the time at RAF Wyton, Parsons and MacGregor went to nearby Great Gransden, the old town 405 Squadron was based out of during the Second World War. They especially visited St. Bartholomew's Church, where there is a stained glass monument to 405 Squadron: "all Pathfinders visit here when in

the area," Parsons said.

Just outside the town was the old grass airstrip 405 Squadron flew from decades ago, now the Cambridge Gliding Centre. Inside the clubhouse, the men met a number of locals and also discovered another historical display, including section detailing the past "mischief of the Canadian airmen," along with some great pictures of wartime Lancaster aircraft.

Looking for supper, the men were told to visit the Crown and Cushion Pub, the only pub in the small town of 1,000 people. There, they saw a picture of Canadian servicemen at a barn - pointed out to them as still intact, just a few hundred feet away.

"In walked a man who was identified as the owner of the barn," Parson said. "We asked if he was a farmer, but he stated he had renovated it to be a studio. We didn't think anything more of it until another local asked if we knew we were talking to 'rock and roll royalty?' Of course, we said 'no,' and he went on to say we may know him from a band called 'Deep Purple.'"

Parsons and MacGregor were sitting with Don Airey,

who played with many other huge bands, including Ozzy Osbourne when he co-wrote the album, "Bark at the Moon."

"Needless to say, we had a great conversation and had to grab a pic!" Parsons said. "He told us he was going on tour in September, starting in LA, so I invited him to come to Greenwood and I would put him up and find a stage for the band. I am still waiting for the call!"

The men left the Crown and Cushion for RAF Fairford, admitting to being about five hours tardy - "but what an experience!" →

# Arctic buoy deployment builds international meteorological database

The second week of July was especially exciting for some members of 413 (Transport and Rescue) Squadron, as they embarked on an Arctic buoy drop. This was the first time 14 Wing Greenwood was tasked with this annual mission.

The crew flew to Resolute Bay, Nunavut, home base for the two full days it took to drop the buoys. Resolute Bay is an Inuit hamlet on Cornwallis Island with a population of around 200. This time of year, they experience 24 hours of daylight and an average temperature of 4.5°C.

The buoys themselves compromise two types: three

large ones were dropped at 300 feet above water, and eight small ones were dropped at 1,000 feet, over either ice or water. As the buoys descended, attached to their parachutes, if it was not too foggy, they could be seen floating to the white earth below. Once settled, the meteorologist on board the Hercules aircraft could almost immediately pinpoint its location.

Along with a GPS and enough batteries to last, hopefully, five years, the buoys possess technological capabilities to help track ice and weather conditions around the ice cap, ultimately leading to everyday weather predictions around the world. There are already many of these buoys spread across the Arctic, forming a meteorological network, so it's the job of the trusted navigator to plan a suitable path for the new buoys, ensuring the drop locations aren't overlapping with previous buoys.

The entire trip was possible with the collaboration of many different individuals and organizations. While the pilots, navigator and loadmasters came from 413 Squadron, the flight engineer and technician came from 424 (Transport and Rescue) Squadron, based out of 8 Wing Trenton. Approximately 34 flying hours on the CC130 Hercules were logged over four days, including transport to and from Resolute Bay and Trenton. The rest of the team incorporated seven civilians from an array of organizations, including Environment Canada, Defence Research

and Development Canada, the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration, the Office of Naval Research and the University of Washington. Together, they built a unique crew and now share lifelong experiences, friendships and thousands of photos and videos. →

This link is specific to the individual user and cannot be shared with other employees in the organization. However, the unique link can be forwarded to personal email and accessed from a mobile device or home computer. The survey may also be completed via telephone at 1-866-539-7829. If you do not receive an invitation after the first week of data collection (July 22 to 26), you may

request a survey email through the Advanis support website. The survey takes approximately 20 to 25 minutes to complete, and employees are to be given time to complete the survey during regular working hours. →

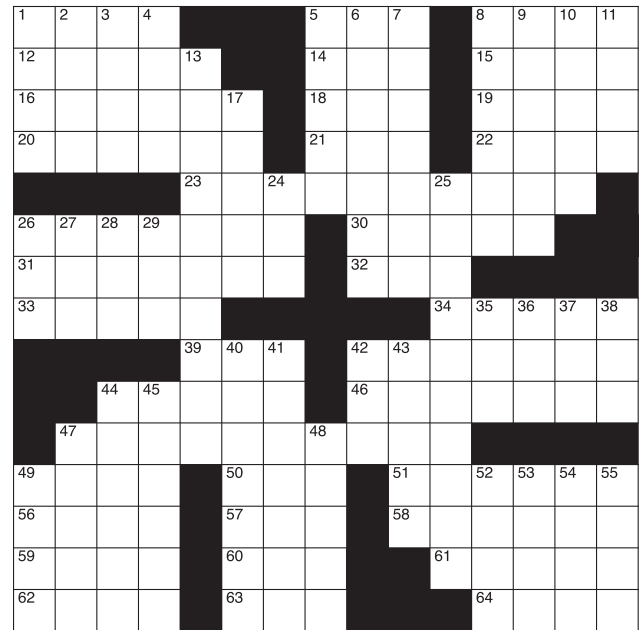

# Kingston/ Greenwood Community Health Board making an impact

The Kingston/ Greenwood Community Health Board (KGCHB) had another successful year, with many new initiatives including collaborating on a new Western Zone health plan that will help govern our activities for the next three years.

This past year, the KGCHB had just over \$11,000 in Wellness Funds to distribute within its catchment area through the Nova Scotia Health Authority's Wellness Funds. The KGCHB received 14 applications to consider, and approved grants for eight.

The CHB facilitated collaboration between the Kingston Library and the 14 Wing Greenwood Sports and Fitness Centre to make gym passes available at the library for short-term sign-out, just like checking out a book!

ness and fitness initiatives. Each pass may be "checked out" for a two-week period, free of charge. Contact the Kingston Library for more information on the program.

The CHB is also chairing a collaborative committee of the four CHBs located in Kings County advocating for the development of a county-wide healthy eating environment policy. This has been ongoing since February, and the goal is to make a presentation to the county's committee of the whole meeting in September.

The KGCHB has formed an active transportation (AT) committee to investigate initiatives that could support human-powered travel (non-motorized). AT can also be about enjoying nature, being healthier and more active, making our villages and towns more liveable and cutting down on air and noise pollution.
