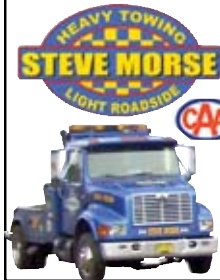

Exercising air power through CUTLASS FURY

Aircraft from 14 Wing Greenwood supported the Navy-led Exercise Cutlass Fury September 9 to 20, based off the coast of Nova Scotia, which combined 20 ships and 36 aircraft from Canada and the United States, plus five partner nations.

Designed as a biennial joint exercise between the Royal Canadian Navy and the Royal Canadian Air Force, Cutlass Fury aims to increase coordination and interoperability between both branches of the military.

Things were initially off to a windy start, with Hurricane Dorian's arrival September 7 requiring the assembling fleet to put to sea and all RCAF assets stayed outside of the operations area; the exercise still kicked off September 9.

14 Wing provided both aircraft and personnel from 405, 404 and 415 squadrons, and also hosted an American P8 and a CP140 crew from 407 Squadron in Comox. All

participated in multiple anti-submarine warfare events during the exercise. On the support side, 14 Wing aircraft technicians and mission support specialists worked long hours to ensure mission success and adjusted successfully to a series of rapidly changing situations. Additionally, 14 Wing provided personnel to staff the air task force (ATF) based out of Halifax, with Greenwood's 14 Operations Support Squadron Commanding Officer Lieutenant-Colonel Serge Parisien as the ATF commander. The ATF also include liaison officers from all of the various aircraft fleets participating in the exercise.

The RCAF's CP140 Aurora demonstrated its capacity as a multi-role platform through anti-submarine, anti-surface and even command and control exercises. Of particular note, one event required the CP140 to vector CF18s participating from 3 Wing Bagotville onto a rapidly-moving target to conduct attack runs in the simulated protection of a friendly vessel. The attack run was a great success, and the crew of the CP140 played

a critical role in its execution.

At other times, crews worked with other anti-submarine assets to locate, track and conduct simulated attacks on submarines. The chance to conduct activities with multiple other CP140s, the P8 and ship-based helicopters from friendly warships was an excellent training opportunity the crews embraced enthusiastically.

Without the support of aircraft and personnel from 14

Wing Greenwood, this event could not have achieved the success that it did. Throughout the two-week period, all participants worked long hours in a fluid exercise environment to accomplish a steadily-more-difficult series of missions. Overall, Exercise Cutlass Fury was instrumental in integrating combined air and naval operations and provided valuable training opportunities for all participants. →

Around the world with Op NEON

Captain Richard Harding, 405 (Long Range Patrol) Squadron

This summer, 14 Wing Greenwood deployed a detachment in support of United Nations Security Council Sanctions against North Korea. Operation NEON monitors and reports any illegal or suspicious ship-to-ship transfers of oil or coal.

With aircrew and technicians from 405 (Long Range Patrol) Squadron and support staff from both 14 and 19 wings, the almost 50-person detachment spent May, June and July deployed to Kadena Airbase in Okinawa, Japan. They flew enforcement missions over the East China Sea, working closely with allied nations.

Aircrew had to deal with a number of challenges resulting from operating in a relatively unexplored corner of the globe for the CP140 Aurora. This

included the beginning of the typhoon season, which led to intense monitoring of the weather, both at the aerodrome prior to take off and in the area of operations. Heavy traffic density, with a significant amount of shipping passing through the area, continually challenged the crew to locate one vessel of significance amongst many.

The crew was constantly aware of surroundings as it dealt with the complicated political situation and territorial zones of multiple countries.

During this operation, the crew also had the chance to work with and tour HMCS Regina, as well as our new naval auxiliary vessel, MV Asterix. Overall, the unique challenges presented by this operation were overcome and the crew had many successful flights.

The aircrew would not have been able to perform to such a high level if not for the personnel that provided an exceptional level of support. Technicians' constant hard work resulted in a 100 per cent serviceability rate and allowed

the aircraft to be quickly put right as issues arose. The mission support specialists dealt with multiple friendly militaries and provided information the crew needed, pre- and post-mission, to ensure safe flights.

The post-mission products were produced by both the intelligence specialists and

the Electronic Sensor Support Section for distribution to headquarters. To ensure everyone could succeed, tactical system technicians were on call to deal with issues that impacted the Deployed Mission Support Centre and spent long hours fixing system glitches and power failures. Ultimately, it was the support team's per-

formance and dedication that enabled the aircrew to perform to the highest standard.

At the end of the deployment, the success was the result of the work performed by all individuals deployed. Everyone worked long hours and went above and beyond to ensure mission success, every day. →

Slower pace for SAR crews

September 10, around 2 p.m., the Halifax Joint Rescue Coordination Centre tasked two 14 Wing Greenwood aircraft for a marine medevac 100 nautical miles southeast of Yarmouth. Both Hercules R336 and Cormorant R911 from 413 (Transport and Rescue) Squadron left the base. By 7 p.m., the helicopter had successfully conducted the medevac,

taking the patient ashore to an ambulance for transport to the Yarmouth hospital. The Hercules had returned to Greenwood, with the Cormorant following shortly afterward.

September 18, at 10 a.m. a Greenwood Cormorant and Hercules were both tasked to assist with a marine medevac 100 nautical miles south of Halifax. →

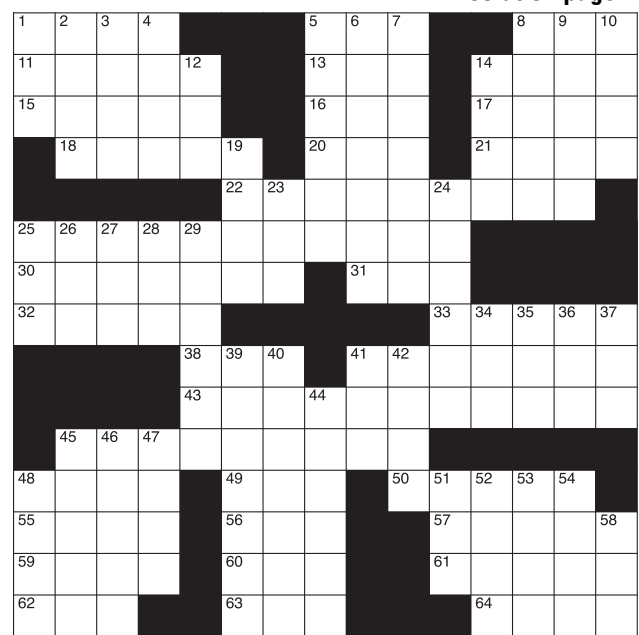

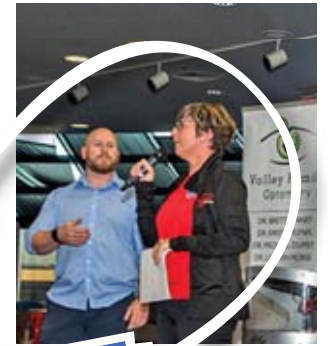
