Wing, Aldershot work highlights infrastructure priorities

There's no seasonal slacking for staff with Real Property Operations Unit – Atlantic Detachment Greenwood, as millions of dollars' worth of infrastructure work is underway, or ready to start.

Rick Nippard, RP Ops' engineering officer, says the 2021/ 2022 budget isn't that last year's was, as federal pandemic stimulus funds targeted work-ready projects, but 2021/ 2022 will see close to \$19 million spent on new work and upgrades worth between \$60,000 and up to \$10 million at 14 Wing Greenwood and 5th Canadian Division Support Base Detachment Aldershot.

"It's a little low, but it still means we're busy," Nippard says. "And, 10 per cent of that money will be used on future designs for next year's work – we need those to tell us what to do."

In the meantime, "there is exciting stuff," Nippard says.

"We're here for the runway and aircraft – they get the 'love' first, but there are different

pots of money and portfolio elements to all projects. We always have a list of work requests from end users, and they're all evaluated, scored and sent to a committee; that's how we decide what we plan to do. Is it related to health and safety? Is it operational? Depending on the size of the project, we may take a year to plan – or more – and fund. Then, we tender; then, implementation.

"It's a juggling act between there's a need, there's merit; and the scoring, justification and funding."

COVID-19 has been a part of the infrastructure picture since March 2020, but Nippard says contractors working on RP Ops' projects have adapted their own safety planning to continue to move projects. There have been some challenges with long lead times on certain building supplies, increased costs and worker shortages.

Camp Aldershot's big year

5th Canadian Division Support Base Detachment Aldershot has a long list of

scheduled work now underway or planned.

A \$1.2 million project will add an extension to the pass control building onto the camp's range, including a double-bay garage to house equipment and vehicles. Work should start this month.

Also starting in September is a \$1.3 million new main gate guardhouse, to be built on the opposite side of the camp entrance roadway. It will be bigger than the 1960s-built guardhouse, and should be complete by April 2022.

A \$2.6 million recap will completely renovate and modernize the camp's kitchen, bringing it to all fire, food prep and storage and safety standards. This project has been on the books for several years, as it involved a great deal of specialized planning and consultations with the end users – the military and civilian cooks who feed the camp's staff and course trainees. Pandemic conditions aligned in this case as, with fewer people in camp this summer, work crews have

been able to tackle the most disruptive construction phases now. By the return of more normal camp operations next summer, a functional kitchen should be in place, supported along the way and as needed by good old flying kitchens.

Five kilometres of perimeter fencing along the range will be replaced this fall, a project worth \$600,000. With trench and tree clearance work, there were wildlife and environmental considerations in the planning.

Hangar work

Search and rescue personnel working in 14 Hangar saw a summer of roof work in 2020; this summer, the second side of the hangar is being re-roofed, over bays B and C, in a \$1.5 million project. Work should be done by the end of October.

9 Hangar renovations continue, as the barrel end walls are abated for asbestos. The old hangar's north and south walls were done in 2020, new windows and doors are in and office spaces have been modernized. 14 Operations Support Squadron expects to take on the like-new hangar by the end of November for allocation.

14 Air Maintenance Squadron personnel will likely be more comfortable, knowing a \$400,000 lightning protection system will be done by the end of October. Every building, particularly those that house aircraft and fuel, should have lightning protection, and systems are inspected annually.

Demo in the explosives area

Following several years' worth of work to bring structures up to modern standard – or build new – in 14 Wing's Explosives Ordnance Disposal area, RP Ops is preparing to demo buildings 100, 107, 135 and 145. These are 1950s- and 1960s-era structures that used to house missiles, bombs and torpedoes, but have been unused in recent years because of their age and condition. Removing the four buildings will cost \$650,000.

New digs for Cadets

Ground will break later this month on a \$2.1 million Hut-style accommodations building for the Greenwood Air Cadet Summer Training Centre. Cadets are typically housed in grouped trailer accommodations in the camp, with staff Cadets in 14 Wing accommodations off the compound. The new space will in-

clude quarters and a common area, and should be complete by late spring 2022.

Out with the old, in with the new

Building 172 is in transition, as most of its staff moved into the air traffic control tower last year. Crews are working around the few remaining personnel on a \$1 million HVAC renovation that should be done by the end of November.

Tap water in sight on the ops side

14 Wing's operational zone has been dependent on bottled water for 11 years: that could be over by the end of 2021.

Perfluoroalkyl and poly-fluoroalkyl substances in old firefighting foam contaminated Well 6. The new Well 10 on the airfield is capable of pumping out 175 gallons of clean water per minute, and work in 2021 to run lines under the runway to Building 319 for distribution is complete. Water from wells 10 and 9 is now running in a flushing program through operational zone systems and, with good results back from ongoing sampling and testing, could see potable tap water available for the first time in years.

Well 6 will then be decommissioned or filled, with ongo-

ing water and soil sampling to monitor conditions. This particular water and well project has cost \$1.8 million so far.

Filling in fencing

A 10-foot tall Type B security fence project along Ad Astra Way will start mid-September and wrap by the end of November, closing in a 2,000-foot section of the airfield between Checkpoint Charlie and the intersection with Snowy Owl Drive. The project will cost \$200,000.

Under-the-road RHU work

Year two of underground water line work in the Residential Housing Units will start September 27: this time affecting 3rd and 4th crescents and a few neighbouring connectors. RP Ops is replacing water lines under the roads and laterals to every RHU in what it knows is a very disrupt-

ive but essential project. 1st and 2nd crescent lines were replaced in 2021; the "flower" streets will be done in 2022, as the multi-year program to replace 60-year old infrastructure continues.

3rd and 4th crescents will be repaved and curbed – an improvement from work done last year on 1st and 2nd crescents – once done, which should be close to the end of December. This phase of the project will cost \$980,000.

Under-the-runway storm-line work

There is a four-foot diameter, 600-foot long pipe that runs under the airfield from the "birdbath," where aircraft are washed, to the Echo runway: the implications of digging that up for needed repairs are immense. Luckily, there's a hack for that.

Once the pipe is drained and

cleaned, a contracted machine can run along through it and lay an inflatable liner. Another machine follows with a spray to "seal" the inflated liner to all the pipe's surfaces. Work should start September 20, take about a week and cost \$500,000.

High, careful work ahead

The \$450,000 contract to demolish the old air traffic control tower cab atop 10 Hangar has been awarded. Work should start by the end of October, with the structure fully removed by March. This work must be carefully managed: decades of renovation work back to the 1950s will be encountered during demo, there will be multiple abatement necessities, and removal must consider FOD (foreign object debris) and its impact on airfield operations. The project will require careful dismantling and craning to ground level, piece by piece.

Over-the-bed water work

Building 33, the multi-storey accommodations block across from the Annapolis Mess, has seen many upgrades in recent years; work is underway now on a \$300,000 sprinkler system installation. This project should be complete by the end of October. →

SAR calls take crews into fall

September 1, just after 3 p.m. a 14 Wing Greenwood-based Cormorant helicopter was tasked by the Halifax Joint Rescue Coordination Centre to help reach a person who had floated away from shore and isolated. The community fire department was on scene first and was able to provide assistance. The Cormorant was stood down en route and returned to base.

September 3, just before 4 p.m., Cormorant Rescue 907 was airborne in support of a JRCC search for two people on Upper Calf Island, near Yarmouth.

September 3, Hercules Rescue 344 launched just before 8 p.m. in support of a search for a Zodiac with three people aboard near Sept-Îles, Quebec. The Zodiac occupants were looking for an overdue canoe when it itself went incommunicado and was overdue. Cormorant Rescue 907 also left for the scene just before midnight. While this unfolded, the canoe and its occupant were located safely ashore. Around 4 a.m. September 4, the Hercules had expended its crew hours and returned to Greenwood, to be tasked again at 8 a.m. Coast Guard and police assets were stood down overnight

due to poor weather, while the Cormorant conducted four shore crawls before refueling, and then returning to the search area. By 8 a.m., the Cormorant crew had landed in Sept-Îles for crew rest, with a back-up crew prepared to launch from Greenwood. By 8 p.m., Rescue 907 had resumed its search and located the Zodiac with all three individuals safely aboard. They were taken to the Sept-Îles airport, and the Cormorant returned to Greenwood around 11:30 p.m.

September 5, Cormorant Rescue 907 was airborne at 6:45 p.m. to assist a hiker with an injury in the vicinity of Fundy National Park. R907 successfully extracted the injured hiker and transferred her to an ambulance near the scene. It returned to Greenwood just before 10 p.m.

September 7, just after 6:30 a.m., Cormorant Rescue 907 launched to help search for an unregistered EPIRB going off northwest of Prince Edward Island. The helicopter homed on the EPIRB and determined it was an accidental activation from a fishing vessel. RSCU 907 stood down and continued with search and rescue standby training for the day. →

14 Wing Greenwood will mark the 81st anniversary of the Battle of Britain September 19.

St. Mark's Protestant Chapel, Church Street, will host a traditional service of remembrance, including standard forms of worship, at 10 a.m. Attendance is limited due to public health guidance around COVID-19: those interested in attending must confirm with Helen Fillmore, 902-765-1494 local 5883 or helen.fillmore@forces.gc.ca, in advance.

Dress for military members with be DEU 1A with medals. Dress for civilians will be formal.

At 2 p.m., 14 Wing and 107 Valley Wing Royal Canadian Air Force Association will host a parade and service at the Greenwood Military Aviation Museum Air Park. This parade is open to the public, and will feature a fly past, wreath laying and music provided by the 14 Wing Band. The public is asked to bring their own chairs, as there is no designated seating for spectators. In case of poor weather, this parade and service will be held at the Annapolis Mess. Following the parade, at approximately 2:45 p.m., 107 Valley Wing RCAF hosts a reception at its centre, with

light refreshments. Minors will not be permitted, as the bar will be open. COVID-19 protocols apply.

The Battle of Britain is considered a crucial turning point in the Second World War. The summer of 1940 was a dark time for the Allied Forces. A large portion of continental Europe had fallen to the Nazis, and Hitler was preparing to launch a full-scale invasion

of Great Britain. Overseas, the RCAF formed five new day-fighter squadrons in 1941. More than 100 Canadians are deemed to have participated in the Battle of Britain, and 23 lost their lives. The experience the Battle of Britain provided to its RCAF participants built future leaders, who understood what was required of fighter squadrons and their leadership. →

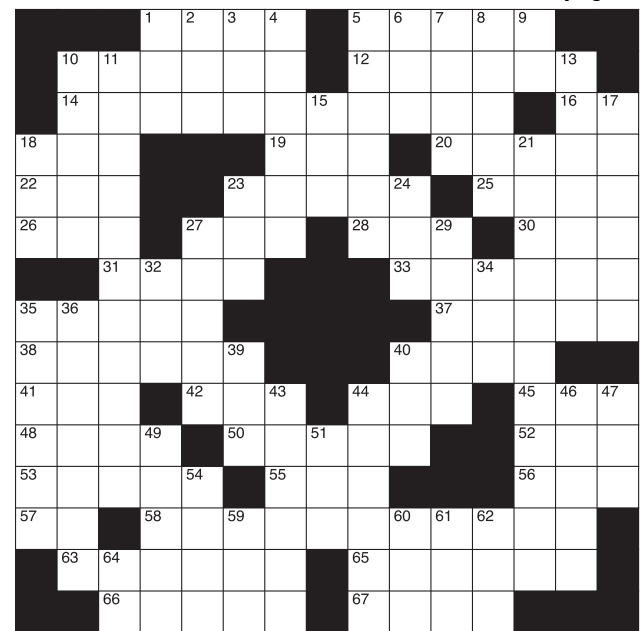

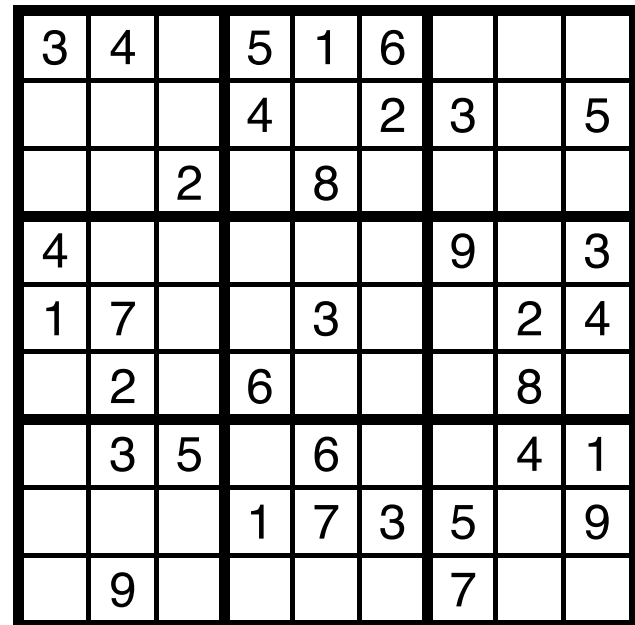

the plan will now focus on implementation. Phased execution of the plan will consider many factors, including the wishes of council, annual

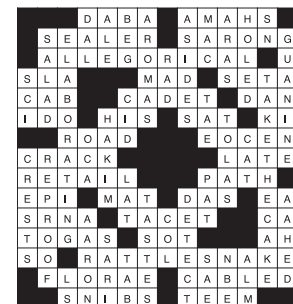
