



## Cross-province route recognizes WNSR roots

A highway route that represents a great deal of history now formally recognizes the people and service of the West Nova Scotia Regiment.

Highway 10, from Middleton to Bridgewater is now called the “The West Nova Scotia Regiment Way.” Members of the regiment, past and present, gathered November 6 at Riverside Park in Middleton for an outdoor formal unveiling.

“It was a glorious day – great weather, and an incredible day,” said Lieutenant-Colonel Mike Bobbitt, WNSR commanding officer. “This renaming is really a tribute to the past, present and future of the regiment.

It acknowledges the history of changes during the Second World War with the two former elements of our regiment, split across the province. This route was used daily to move people and equipment – and, with our armoury in Middleton and Bridgewater – while not used to the same level – it’s still raveled regularly.”

This project was several years in the making. In summer 2019, Richard Stonier, a former West Nova recently retired from a 35-year career in the Royal Canadian Corps of Signals as a master warrant officer in Battersea,

outside of Kingston, Ontario, and the step-son of Colonel (retired) Ron Stonier, WNSR lieutenant-colonel between 1986 and 1990 and 2002 and 2004; presented an idea to the WNSR Regimental Association. Richard saw a highway near Belleville, dedicated to the Hastings and Prince Edward Regiment, and thought the West Novas should have one as well. His suggestion was Hwy 10 be named for and dedicated to the soldiers of the WNSR, as it links the Annapolis Valley and Bridgewater area. The regiment’s wartime headquarters and armoury is at one end, and the West Nova Exhibit in the Macdonald Museum and regimental armoury in Middleton is at the other.

WNSR Honorary Colonel Don Downe, a former provincial cabinet minister, took the proposal to the Nova Scotia government for consideration. It did take two years, but the idea became a reality and signs recognizing the dedication of the highway were erected at both ends of its 55-mile length in April 2021.

Lieutenant-Colonel Ken Butterworth, former WNSR commanding officer, and Downe, former WNSR honorary colonel, had unveiling honours, as both held their WNSR roles when the Highway 10 renaming was

initiated. Bobbitt said a highlight of the event was the opportunity created to bring former and current WNSR members together, after so long separated by COVID-19 – and the passing of years.

“Quite a few of the folks there were from when I joined the regiment back in the 1990s, and they were seeing some others for the first time in 30 years themselves! Our current members – they were definitely impressed to see that.

and Emergency Services firefighters collected just over \$700 with their Fire Prevention Week door-to-door campaign in the Residential Housing Units neighbourhood on behalf of the Nova Scotia Fire Fighters Burn Treatment Society. Combined Charities' annual campaign results are distributed among up to 60 local and regional non-profit groups, including youth programs, veterans, sports and recreation clubs, animal welfare, health campaigns and more.
