Jones' 42+ year CAF career 'I liked it well enough'

There aren't too many Canadian Armed Forces members actively serving with a third bar to a Canadian Forces Decoration: 14 Wing Greenwood's Captain Fred Jones is pretty low-key about his 42 years – and counting – enlisted years. "I've liked it well enough," he says, describing everything from his youthful days as an Army Cadet to 12 years as an infantry Reservist, driving AVGPs (armoured vehicle general purpose), to becoming a pilot.

"The military is not for everyone – some temperaments will do well. I'd recommend it, sure."

In fact, Jones figures he'll stick around awhile longer: he has an extension to work to age 65, which would take him to the end of 2025.

"I try to be useful."

Jones grew up in Copper Cliff, Ontario, a mining town just outside of Sudbury. His dad, a Welsh surgeon in the British Army through the Sec-

ond World War followed by some time in the Reserves, moved to Canada, met Jones' mother – also new to Canada from Italy; they married, he started at Inco doing company medical work, and Jones was born.

"It was a very small town, with a small town feel," Jones describes his home. "I was an only child. I liked school and did reasonably well."

Not particularly sporty, Jones joined Cadets, and then the Reserves while still in high school, in January 1979. A buddy had joined the artillery just before him; Jones picked infantry: "I wanted to do something different – I sure wouldn't want to do it now! They were recruiting, and I didn't put too much thought into it."

Jones was with The Royal Regiment of Canada – he also didn't consider the regiment's formal uniform hat: a foot tall bearskin piece (the regiment's less formal white pith helmet was a little more wearable). He earned a university biology degree and taught first aid with St. John Ambulance.

"One day on the bulletin board at work, there was a poster up they were looking for 'Guinea pigs' to put in the centrifuge to check new G-suits up to 7 g," Jones says. "I signed up for that, and they put me through a medical – and

then they told me, 'by the way, you passed for a pilot medical.' "I'd never thought about pilot, that it was even within reach – but I started thinking about it."

Jones, then an army master corporal, applied for the Regu-

lar force and wrote the aircrew test – and passed.

"I was pretty excited – I found it pretty challenging, with no flying experience before."

With 12 years under his belt carrying into his first Royal Canadian Air Force year, Jones

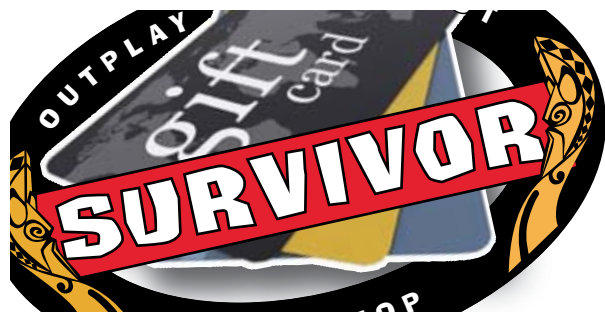

was presented the Canadian Forces Decoration in 1992. He continued to train on the Tutor jets in Moose Jaw, rotary aircraft in Portage la Prairie and multi-engine aircraft.

"It was pretty apparent to me at the time I was not cut out for the 'sportier' side of flying in the jets. I liked the sedate, crew-orientated experience of the multi-engines, and I was a little older than a lot of the others in the school."

Married and with a new son, Jones' first posting was in Ontario, but they were quickly posted to Nova Scotia - 14 Wing - in 2000, flying 405 Squadron's Aurora.

"We did maritime patrol, and then after 9/11, I was deployed twice to the Persian Gulf on Op Apollo - once on flights and once on base operations."

Long range patrol, and all those hours in flight?

"It was very interesting, and I enjoyed it. I never found it dull - we went to Australia and did Fincastle (we did NOT win); I've been to Iqaluit, Keflevik, Sigonella, Kinloss, Portugal, Seville.... The international

maritime patrol community is very collegial - there are different aircraft, but people understand the work. It was very pleasant."

Jones moved in 2004 from 405 Squadron into Wing Operations, and a series of deployments put off new postings repeatedly: while his wife recently figured out he'd spent a cumulative four years away from her and their two children (now grown), he's now been 22 years straight in Greenwood.

"It happened - not by design. I figure, moving me would have been more of an expensive waste of time than leaving me here."

Jones also realized he was "never going to be a general - it wasn't me."

"I have a windowless room here. I started off as the duty watch officer - the voice at the other end of the line for everything; I was the scheduling officer for the Aurora, I was the senior operations officer of

the duty watch crew, I was A3 transport if we needed airlift to take stuff anywhere. In fact, I've l bopped around Greenwood with Wing Operations, actually, without ever even leaving this building."

Jones added the CD's first bar to his medals in 2002, followed by the second bar in 2012. Wing Operations became 14 Operations Support Squadron, and Jones hasn't been in a plane as a pilot in years. He admits he misses the flying, but not the constant checks, paperwork and stress of a flying schedule and being away from home. The CD3 this summer, he says, simply reflects he's a "member in good standing."

He is pretty pleased, though, with the Bronze status he achieved on his annual FORCE fitness test, and his advancing years may even help his score higher as he works his way through 2025. He's spending time building scale models of aircraft, armoured vehicles and

boats (a submarine he built and took to the Greenwood Military Aviation Museum had just been presented by another builder, so his sits in the Hornell Centre), and he's exploring computer programs to move his

sketched aircraft portraits and side views to digital spaces - something he could see himself doing more of when he retires.

"It's funny, looking through old photos - it's been interesting. The military is like any job:

there are some mornings you get up out of bed and go. But, looking back, it's been very nice, and I have very warm memories.

At sea medevacs keep SAR crews busy

September 9, the Halifax Joint Rescue Coordination Centre tasked a 14 Wing Greenwood based Cormorant helicopter with 413 (Transport and Rescue) Squadron, to medevac a

65-year-old man with health issues from a cruise ship 95 miles south of Cape Sable. R905 was airborne from Greenwood at 7:17 a.m., and successfully extracted the individual, return-

ing to 14 Wing by 4 p.m.

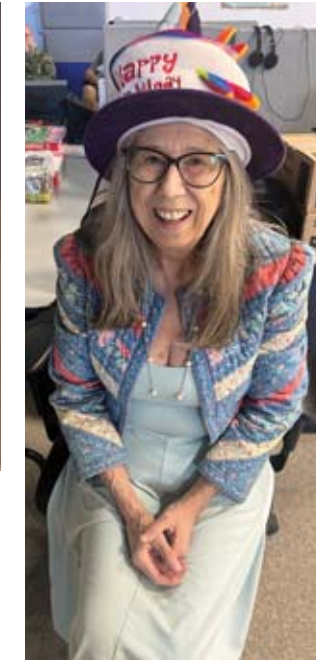
September 12, a Hercules was tasked at 3 p.m. to provide top cover for a Gander-based Cormorant hoisting an injured crewmember from a fishing

vessel approximately 200 nautical miles east of St. John's. The Hercules was later stood down.

September 12, Cormorant Rescue 905 was tasked just after 8:30 p.m. to conduct a medevac

south of Anticosti Island. R905 was able to extract the patient, a nurse and the patient's spouse, transferring them to an ambulance in Halifax shortly after 5 a.m.

September 13, Cormorant Rescue 901 was airborne at 11:23 a.m., heading to Sydney for a tasking. R901 later returned to Greenwood, as Gander was able to pick up the tasking. →

Gagetown takes Atlantic soccer title

It'll be the CFN Gagetown Warriors representing the Atlantic region at this fall's Canadian Armed Forces women's soccer championships.

14 Wing Greenwood hosted the regional tournament August 29 to September 2, with Gagetown and CFB Halifax sending teams to make up the competition.

14 Wing Greenwood Commander Colonel Jeff Davis greeted teams August 30.

"Welcome to Halifax, the returning champions as we are back at regionals, the first in three years. Welcome to Gagetown, my hometown: you're near and dear to my heart - but quite so much as my team here in blue! Best of luck to all."

Davis congratulated the tournament organizers for pulling the week of games and social activities together, and thanked the officials in advance for being "our favourite people on the pitch - usually!"

Wing Chief Warrant Officer Jonathan Proulx encouraged

team members to enjoy the opportunity offered through the CAF sports program "to meet people this week your normally wouldn't."

"And we challenge you to fierce competition on the field." Opening action saw Greenwood on the schedule twice - first up against Halifax, and losing 1-0, then meeting Gagetown in the afternoon and losing 3-0.

August 31, Gagetown and Halifax met for the only game of the day, with Halifax winning 2-1 over Gagetown in penalty kicks. September 1, Gagetown and Greenwood re-matched in the semi-final, with Gagetown winning 2-0.

The September 2 final saw Gagetown take a 1-0 lead and hold it over Halifax throughout, winning the Atlantic title and the national berth.

Greenwood's captain, Major Jacinda Vlaar, said the week was good competition, "although the second game on the first day was tough."

"We had almost a full team - health, people away, but it was definitely fun and great to meet all these people." →
